Questionnaires showed that there is a real need for such a service but the actual number of children needing care before and after school was not sufficient to make setting up a club viable at the present time. The situation is being kept under review.

The committee did feel that if there were one or two registered childminders in the village, this would help to meet the need. Anyone interested in looking into registering as a childminder can find out further details on the legal requirements and the registration process by ringing the Family Information Service on 0845 6011 630. They will send out an information pack which will include an invitation to a Childminding pre registration meeting where you will have the opportunity to find out what is involved and to ask questions.
