What's God got to do with it? - Nothing!

Progressively over the last 40 years people in Britain have stopped going to church and have little belief in a Creator – God. We have an understanding of life that does not depend on God. **We** control our lives and **we** set our priorities and goals without any reference to any 'being' outside ourselves – be that an eternal being or other human beings. This is Freedom! God has nothing to do with it! The Christian Church is a waste of time!

SWIFTS!

In the spring and summer months, have you sometimes looked up and wondered what those birds, with long, scythe-like wings are, that appear to spend most of their time screaming overhead, as if there was no tomorrow?

These birds are swifts. Weighing only about 1½ ounces (44 grams), they migrate all the way from southern Africa to breed in Sheriff Hutton (and other places). They sleep, feed and mate on the wing, only landing to build their nests and raise their chicks.

Swifts begin breeding at 4 years old, and each year they return to the same nest to breed, in caves or hollows of trees, but these days, more commonly in holes in house walls or in spaces under the eves, tiles, gables, flashing and pointing. If they are disturbed or excluded from their nest site, they probably will not breed that year and their long journey will have been for nothing.

The number of swifts breeding in Britain has halved since the 1980s. This is partly due to pesticide usage, but more due to the renovation of houses, blocking off access holes, placing grilles over vents, and building new houses that do not have access to roof spaces. Because swifts are site-faithful they will often injure themselves or even die trying to gain access to old nest sites that have been blocked up.

Swifts do not harm buildings and leave very little mess. They nest right next to the entrance hole, so they do not get into your roof space and do damage. When nesting under tiles, they nest on top of the roofing felt just below the entrance hole.

So, next year, if you are thinking of repairing a roof, in particular replacing the fascias or re-pointing verge tiles (especially curvy clay pantiles), remember that like all wild birds, swifts are protected and it is illegal to disturb nesting birds (April to August), even if they are still building their nests.

When pointing verges, consider leaving gaps in which they have nested: not every gap has to be filled with mortar. Cut holes in the soffits or fascia boards, to match old entrances, lengthen flashings to let swifts in, insert "swift bricks", etc. www.london-swifts.co.uk has lots of ideas and pictures.

Swifts can live up to 21 years and it is likely that they will have been living in your house longer than you have! These lovely creatures enrich our lives by their spectacular aerial flights and displays and feats of endurance, and help us by catching spiders, midges and mosquitoes. It would be a pity to reduce their numbers still further by our thoughtless and sometimes selfish actions.

If you would like to know more about birds, or see some close up, contact us.
