The Parish Council Meeting was held on Friday 9th July, 2010. It was attended by Cllrs D Wooles (Chairman), Mrs J Calvert, D Weston, B Parkinson, I Read and N Anfield. Clerk BC Taylor (878060). Apologies were received from Cllr Mrs P Bean (Vice Chairman).

Presentation 'Community Emergency Scheme' by Katie Speed, Emergency Planning Officer, NYCC

The Sheriff Hutton Emergency Plan was drawn up by the Parish Council in 2001 and is now out of date. The NYCC presentation covered details from their Community Resilience Plan soon to be launched on the internet. Councillors felt that the Plan was mainly for use by Town Councils but agreed that there were important aspects to be considered in bringing the Parish Emergency Plan up to date and the assistance offered by NYCC in this exercise would be invaluable. This item will be discussed by the Parish Council at a later meeting and meanwhile the Community Resilience Plan website details, when released, will be published in the Village News.

Wind Turbines in Sheriff Hutton

The Group formed 'to oppose any proposal to site commercial wind turbines near to Sheriff Hutton and Terrington' has been formed. Apart from Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer it includes representatives from Terrington (3), Sheriff Hutton (3), Valley (4) and High Stittenham (2). They met initially to agree their aim, to identify activity areas and to allocate investigation tasks to members.

The Parish Council has received a letter from three residents putting the other case for wind turbines used to generate electricity. They have asked the Council to keep this letter to one side and consider its content when the time comes for the Parish Council to make its positive decision for or against the wind turbines in the area (see item top of page 2 in the July edition of Village News). The Council has agreed to do so.

Village Fair

The Village Fair will be given permission to operate on the Village Green between 26th and 31st July 2010, 6pm to 9pm Thursday & Friday, 2pm to 9pm Saturday.

Grant for Bus Shelter

The funding for the alterations to the bus shelter at the bottom of Coble Lane is in place. The contractors will start work shortly. The plan is to supply a toughened glass insert in one side facing the direction of the approaching bus and a notice board in the other side for use by the Parish.

Charity Cycle Ride Challenge for Haiti and Chile Earthquake Victims

Jonathan Carter (Laurels Garth, Sheriff Hutton) and Andrew Smith (Image Playgrounds, Sheriff Hutton Industrial Estate) have decided to help the sufferers of this years earthquakes in Haiti and Chile. They have organised with 10 other friends to cycle from London to Paris on the bank holiday weekend in August. This is certainly a challenge because they will be cycling a distance of 296 miles with the aim to raise £10,000 for Article 25.

Article 25 is a UK registered charity that designs and delivers buildings and structures for those in greatest need worldwide. This year much of their aid work has taken place in Haiti and Chile following the two earthquakes. Throughout Haiti's affected areas, poor standards of construction and deficient materials were the root cause of tremendous structural failures and, ultimately, an overwhelming loss of life. Article 25 aims to ensure the reconstruction in Haiti and Chile goes beyond restoring what was lost and introduces building methods for sound, earthquake and hurricane resistant construction. Jonathan, Andrew and the team aim to raise £10,000 for Article 25 through their cycling challenge and they can't do this without your donations.
