The Meeting on 8th January 2010 was attended by Cllrs D Wooles (Chairman) , Mrs J Calvert (Vice Chairman) , D Weston , Mrs P Bean , N Anfield and I Read . Clerk BC Taylor (878060). Apologies were received from Cllr B Parkinson .

Progress on Matrix in Sheriff Hutton

A site Meeting has been organised with a representative of NYCC to discuss the locations at which the Travelling Matrix can be installed to monitor the speed of traffic through the Village. This took place on 13th January.

Street Lights: Maintenance & Repair

All street lights reported with defects have now been repaired with the exception of the light outside Bertram House in West End Lane. This light requires replacement which is being dealt with by Ryedale DC.

In view of the bad weather and the age of street lights in the Village it is proposed to have them all tested by Ryedale DC and NYCC, who have shared responsibility.

Pathway between Village Hall and The Lodge

The responsibility for maintenance of this pathway has been accepted by NYCC who will cut back the edges and keep them clear with effect from early Spring 2010.

Christmas Lights

It was agreed that more lights should be bought for the Christmas Tree. It has been noted that the new tree is not growing in an upright position and advice will be sought from the supplier as to how to cure this problem and care for the tree.

Screening from Industrial Estate

The Clerk has requested, in writing, a site meeting with the Ryedale Planning Officer to discuss the screening of light from the Industrial Estate.

Grit Bins in Village

It had been noticed that all the Grit Bins had been refilled. It was confirmed that NYCC commits to fill salt bins twice a year, once in the Autumn and again in or immediately after a bad spell of weather. The Criteria for Grit Bins to be supplied and maintained by NYCC has been relaxed slightly. It was agreed that the Council would apply for two more Grit Bins to be located between Terrington View and Laurels Garth and also at either end of Coble Lane.

Bus Shelter in Coble Lane:

There had been no response from Residents with ideas on how to weatherproof the bus shelter and Councillors decided to brick the shelter up at both ends. Quotes will be obtained.

Planning Applications

09/01347/HOUSE: Mr & Mrs D Noble: Erection of two-storey/part single-storey extension to side, single-storey glazed extension to rear, single-storey porch/utility extension with canopy and linked double garage, re-building of chimney stack and replacement and addition of windows: at Church Farmhouse and Church Cottage, Church End, Sheriff Hutton, YO60 6SY

Councillors agreed to support the Application in its present form.

An Update

A reminder has been received from a Resident about the Litter Bin and Dog Waste Bin in Coble Lane mentioned in the Parish Council News section of the June 2009 Edition of The Village News.

The installation of the Litter Bin has been held up for the following reason. There is an insurance claim outstanding for the replacement of the Bin and Seat in Finkle Street which were demolished by a car. It was planned that these two bins would be replaced at the same time to cut down on material costs for installation. The delay experienced in finalising the Insurance Claim was not envisaged at the time.

The installation of the Dog Waste Bin has been delayed for the following economic reason. The cost obtained for a Dog Waste Bin in June 2009 was £243 plus VAT plus installation charges. Shortly after this time Ryedale Streetscene brought out a scheme offering subsidised Dog Waste Bins at the price of £70 per bin + VAT and free installation. It was decided to apply for two bins in this scheme. The closing date for the scheme was 4th January 2010 and now the allocation of bins can start. The approval of the application remains with Ryedale DC and a decision is awaited.

Our January meeting was yet another victim of the extreme wintry weather and had to be cancelled because of the icy state of the footpaths and the car park. We look forward to seeing all our members at our next meeting on Wednesday 10th February at 7.30pm in the Village Hall when Mr Brian Handley is our speaker and will tell us of the decision of the community to fight the closure of Stillington Post Office and how it is now run as a community project.

Dear Friends,

Jesus went out into the desert for forty days and forty nights. The desert was a wilderness place, a place where survival becomes very important. It is a place where life and death come close together, and it has often been seen as a place where people meet with God. In Israel there was always a kind of idea that when they were wandering through the desert they were closest to God. God was seen as a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night. They had an idea that that was a time when Israel was particularly close to God. (That is not how it comes across when reading Exodus itself!).

But we are people who are used to our modern comfortable lifestyle. We are used to centrally heated homes, that are lit by electric lights. We are used to lots of modern conveniences, and most of us have probably only seen deserts on the television. In many ways we are not very comfortable with the desert and its stark reminders of life and death. We are not used to the discomforts that it would bring. So we have rarely if ever been into a desert or experienced a place of wilderness.

But that was the place that Jesus chose to spend some time at the very beginning of his ministry. We think of it as a place where Jesus went to think about what he was going to do over the next few years. We think of it as a time when he prepared himself for all that was to come. He left behind his home and family to spend some time in the desert. He met with John there and was baptised. He then spent a gruelling time of fasting and praying for six weeks before setting out on his ministry.

We are approaching the time of Lent. It was a time when we think about Jesus in the desert abandoning the comforts of a home for a time. We think of him fasting and praying for all of that time, and the hunger that that must have produced. The challenge for us each Lent is to think about the place in the wilderness. We are challenged to think about life and death, and the importance of God in our lives. We are challenged to think about our Christian faith as we approach Easter, the most important festival of the Christian year.

How far are we prepared to move from our comfort zones for God? How much hunger are we prepared to endure? Are we going to give something up to spur us to think of our relationship with God more? How closely are we prepared to follow Jesus into the desert? Ultimately what are we prepared to give up for God? If the answer to that is nothing, then what does that say about our faith? Lent is a challenging time. It was challenging for Jesus, it was a matter of survival. How are we going to spend Lent? Are we going to skirt round the desert to get the celebration of Easter? Or are we going to wander through the desert taking seriously its deprivations? Are we going to be ready to be changed by God as we weigh up what is most important in our lives and our faith? Or do we stay in our comfort zones?
