The Meeting on 12th February 2010 was attended by Cllrs D Wooles (Chairman), Mrs J Calvert (Vice Chairman), D Weston, B Parkinson, Mrs P Bean, N Anfield and I Read. Clerk BC Taylor (878060).

#### Repair to Street Light

The broken light in North Garth Lane requires a new lantern and rewiring. This will take up to 5 weeks to complete and authority was given to incur the expense.

#### **Progress on Matrix**

A meeting took place on 13th January 2010 with a NYCC Highways representative and it was proposed to site a mobile matrix at 30mph sign on the York Road from the Strensall direction and at the mini roundabout from the Terrington direction. NYCC Highways have placed the statutory advertisement in the press and there have been no objections. The matter is now with North Yorkshire Police.

#### **Grit Bins in Village:**

The application for grit bins (see Village News February) has been passed to NYCC with the addition of an extra one at the top of the hill in The Croft. They will now assess the requested locations against their criteria.

#### **Christmas Lights:**

The lights will be purchased when available through the retailer. A Ryedale DC grant is on hand for the purchase. The supplier of the tree has assured the Council that the tree will grow in the correct direction of its own accord.

#### **Bus Shelter Coble Lane:**

The plan is for vandal-proof glass to be installed at the end towards the on-coming bus. The other end will be bricked up and a notice board will be inset into it. Quotations are being sought for a grant application to be made before the end of the current financial year.

Sheriff Hutton's District Council Representative, Eric Hope, is assisting in the task of setting up a site meeting with representatives from the District Council.
