Ryedale DC has provided a quote for the removal of the old column in Terrington View. It was agreed that this work should go ahead once the replacement is in place. The light in West End opposite Bertram House has been repaired and the shield requested has been installed.

Planning Application

10/01105/HOUSE: Mr R Ruddy: Erection of part two-storey extension to north elevation at High Roans, Sheriff Hutton Road, Strensall York YO32 5TS.

Councillors supported the application in its present form.

Wind Farms

A planning sub-committee has been formed to further relationships with Ryedale DC and monitor the Coalition Government's policy on Wind Power. A further sub-committee is involved in keeping residents enthusiastic and informed.

A letter has been received from Scottish Power Renewables (SPR) indicating that their decision on whether to go ahead with development in the valley will not be made before Summer 2011.

Whilst waiting to see what develops from SPR and the Government, the Committee have decided to postpone their launch, scheduled for November/December, whilst remaining ready to act if the situation changes.

The Next Meeting will take place on Thursday, 4th November 2010 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

What can you remember about the year 2010 so far? We can usually remember when the sun shone -in June, the clouds in August and the mini summer once the children were back at school. Perhaps that is why the great rescue operation in Chile was so poignant; we can all imagine how terrible it must be to live in the dark. When the 33 miners emerged on 14th October, wearing protective sunglasses in case the light damaged their eyes, the whole nation came together to celebrate an amazing rescue. Light and life go together. One of the fixtures of November, whatever the weather, is the shortening days, the lack of light. You can understand those who suffer from SAD syndrome, depression caused by not enough sunlight. We all need light to flourish.

Light symbolises triumph over darkness. We light a candle at the Remembrance service for All Souls Day to symbolise the life of our loved ones who have died. 'Light a candle, don't just curse the dark' reminds us how powerful a small flame can be. A friend organises services on the beach in Scarborough in the summer months. As darkness falls, everyone is invited to light a candle on the beach. Most do and the sands are covered with a mass of flickering light.

Perhaps that is why the advent of Christ is often greeted with a special service of light in cathedrals all over England. Advent Sunday is on November 28th. In places like St Paul's the church is dimmed, and gradually candles are lit and the darkness is pushed aside. This reminds us what happens when Christ comes into our lives. He pushes out the dark places and transforms what we can see.

It's what we can do. One candle is not very powerful, but fill the building with them and the effect is amazing. It's easy to become depressed, reading and hearing about the gloomy events around us; the economy, climate change and the natural disasters which occur. Try lighting a candle and thinking of one positive thing which has happened today. If we all did this Sheriff Hutton would be a blaze of light, even in November.
