Parish Council News

The Parish Council Meeting was held on Friday 13th August, 2010. It was attended by Cllrs D Wooles (Chairman), Mrs. P Bean (Vice Chairman), D Weston, B Parkinson, I Read and N Anfield. Clerk BC Taylor (878060).

Apologies were received from Cllr Mrs. J Calvert

Presentation 'Rural Affordable Housing in Sheriff Hutton' by Phil Hancock, Rural Housing Enabler, Ryedale DC: Mr. Hancock had done a considerable amount of research on the affordable housing market in Ryedale.

Part of his brief is to look for houses in the district which have been empty for 6 months. There are 13 in the vicinity of Sheriff Hutton of which 7 are inside the village. The average rental value of properties in the area is high.

The housing stock available for purchase is largely overvalued and out of the reach of first-time buyers, for which the maximum affordable resource is in general £120,000. Having read in the Parish Plan that the village wished to support the concept of the provision of affordable housing he felt that because of the on-going speculative nature of property and land values this does not appear to be the right time to consider the matter.

Telephone Box opposite Post Office: is now repaired and working.

Street Lighting - Bulk Clean and Change: has been authorised and paid for by the Parish Council.

Copper Beech Tree outside Yew Tree House, The Green, Sheriff Hutton: requires crown reduction pruning, as recommended by the Ryedale DC Tree Officer to prevent encroachment on the neighbouring property. The Parish Council will submit a 'Notice for Work to be Carried out on Trees in a Conservation Area' to Ryedale DC.

Tree on the Little Green (Parish Council number 055): is infested with Canker and advice will be sought on felling.

Planning Application:

10/00767/FUL: Mrs. S Perkins: Erection of single-storey extension to rear, at Honeybee Cottage East End Sheriff Hutton York YO60 6SX. Councillors agreed to support the application in its present form.

The next Meeting will take place on 10th September 2010 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

New Hearing Loop in the Village Hall

Thanks to the generosity of a Sheriff Hutton resident and a grant from North Yorkshire County Council the Main Hall is now fitted with an induction loop system to help people who use hearing aids. All regular hirers will be contacted soon to explain how the system is activated.

Village Hall 'Spring Clean'

A small but welcome group of helpers met up in the Village Hall on August 7th to dust down the high ledges, remove any cobwebs, heavy-clean the kitchen and toilets, wash most of the plastic chairs and clear back growth on the footpath and car park. We say "thank you" to them and hope all the hall's users will appreciate their efforts.

New Cups and Saucers. As part of the spring clean the contents of the kitchen were checked against the inventory. In less than a year 24 cups have disappeared – far more than the usual level of inevitable breakages. We have purchased 48 new cups and saucers to cover for the losses, and to ensure we have sufficient for the biggest crowd the Hall can hold, at a cost of £123.08. This sum has been funded by the Friends of the Village Hall whose efforts are very much appreciated.
