Councillors present at the meeting were Douglas Wooles (Chairman), Penny Bean (Vice-Chairman), Marcus Oxendale, Martin Dodd, Dave Smith and Sally Downing. The Clerk was Louise Pink and there were two members of the public present for part of the meeting.

### Planning Applications for consideration – No new planning applications.

After production of the agenda re-consultation documents were received in relation to planning application 16/00965/MFUL – Peckett's Yard. These revised documents related to amended layout and further drainage details only. The Parish Council maintain its original objections to this planning application and wish to add that there is already a fully supported planning application within the village, by both the Parish Council and the community at Mill Lane for 12 affordable houses.

A friend from this area needed an urgent lift into York this week to go to the Bank.

The friend had been telephoned by the credit card company to ask about card transactions over the previous weekend that the company thought were suspicious. They gave details of two substantial transactions of which my friend knew nothing. They gave instructions that my friend should transfer all but a small amount into a temporary account to thwart the fraudsters. They provided an Account number and sort code. The caller was very plausible. Fortunately in the rush to get to the bank my friend forgot the bank cards and it was only when we started talking about it that we realised that the whole thing was a scam. The credit card company was contacted. The suspicious transactions did not exist. They had not requested the transfer of monies to a temporary account. My friend was lucky. **Beware calls of this sort.**

## Neighbourhood Watch

At the meeting on Monday 3rd October, 7 coordinators and 3 members of the public attended, with 6 apologies for absence. Unfortunately the scheduled talk had to be postponed, and the Police were unable to be represented. The next meeting will probably be in January, but the actual date and scheduled talk have still to be arranged.

In the last month there has been an incidence of Lamping in the Lilling area, when two deer were killed, and the meat removed from the carcasses, which were abandoned. Lamping usually takes place at this time of year in the early morning hours, anyone travelling at that time should keep an eye open for such activity and report to 101. The Police often check out any vehicles on the road at that time, so be aware of that.

The fish sellers and traders reported here last month have apparently turned up in the East Riding, and a property in Farlington was burgled during daylight. In view of the longer hours of darkness it is essential that your property is secure, and be wary of late callers.

## Playgroup News

A massive thanks to anyone who attended our Quiz Night last month, we had a packed school hall and I think everyone had a great night, we raised nearly £500!! Watch this space for the details of the next one!

Fundraising is vital to the survival of the village playgroup, the voluntary committee is responsible for the running of Babies and Toddlers; a group for parents/carers to attend with their preschool child (0-5yrs) and the Pre-School Playgroup; offering childcare for 2, 3 and 4 year olds. We offer the same opportunities for early years learning as a full day care nursery but around school hours. Our close relationship with school means that our children can have a really smooth transition to school life.

Unfortunately, as more parents return to work after having their children and require longer hours of care we are finding it increasingly difficult to recruit enough children to cover the costs involved in running the Pre-School Playgroup.

We feel our place in the village community is essential, we can offer affordable childcare to allow children to have new and varied learning experiences, socialise and develop their sense of independence, all crucial to support their development. Babies and Toddlers can be a lifeline to new mums who get support and may make lifelong friendships there. The Playgroup has been part of the village for over 45 years and we do not want it close, as has sadly happened this year in Terrington. Please support your village Playgroup, thank you.

## Sheriff Hutton History Group

**The Pickering Murals**, presented by Dr Kate Giles, gave us a fascinating and informative insight into how the Church responded to the changing faiths of subsequent monarchs.

With King Henry VI on the throne all religious artifacts were removed and wall paintings were whitewashed over. In Pickering the magnificent murals caused an exchange between the then incumbent Rev Ponsonby, the Archbishop of York and local Antiquarians which resulted in the attempted destruction of the paintings .. but along came Rev Lightfoot in 1870 who began the restoration of these magnificent murals. Kate gave us a very interesting narrative through the paintings which feature scenes from the Old and New Testaments, bringing the bible to life for the parishioners. ## The Coach Road: Good News

As a result of an enquiry by a villager regarding the legal status of the footpath running along the Coach Road by the Lodge as far as the lake next to Sheriff Hutton Hall, County Councillor Clare Wood has received the following reply from NYCC officers: *"It is correct that the Definitive Map Modification Order was confirmed on 30 June 2016 following the Public Inquiry earlier in June. I can confirm that no appeal was lodged within the relevant time period so the footpath now legally exists, as described in the Modification Order as modified by the Inspector. The working copy of the Definitive Map, and the on-line mapping have been updated, and when a revised edition of the Definitive Map is issued the new footpath will be shown. In the meantime the Modification Order is the legal record of the footpath. The Countryside Access section are aware that there are misleading signs that now need to be removed and an officer is attempting to find the owner of the signs, to arrange for the removal."*
