The Parish Council Meeting was held on Friday 11th March 2011. It was attended by Cllrs D Wooles (Chairman), Mrs P Bean (Vice Chairman), D Weston, I Read, B Parkinson and N Anfield. Clerk BC Taylor (878060).

County Cllr Clare Wood attended as a guest.

Report by County Councillor Clare Wood

NYCC budget will concentrate on the maintenance of highways. Potholes will be repaired on a discretionary basis. The review of library services is not yet completed but, if the mobile library is removed then a system involving home library may come into play. The bus budget will continue, particularly for the 181 service. It is not at risk yet but the motto is 'Use it or lose it'.

The issue of Public Right of Way over the Coach Road will go before the NYCC Ryedale Area Sub Committee on 14th March 2011. A decision will be made at the meeting of that committee in May, for which a date and location have yet to be arranged.

A question was raised regarding the road traffic matrix to record and regulate the flow and speed of traffic through the village. Cllr Mrs Wood will enquire into the position of Sheriff Hutton on the list.

Industrial Estate

It was reported that the Industrial Estate had become very untidy with indiscriminate piles of pallets and metal fence panels with other rubbish deposited by the sides of the estate roads. Concern was also expressed regarding the lack of screening which should have been installed prior to the latest construction works commencing. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to Woodhouse Barry regarding these issues.

Street Lights

It was reported that a street light in Calvert's Garth had gone out and it had no column number. If that is the case, it may very well be the responsibility of the Parish Council to repair and the Clerk will investigate. Since this report it has been confirmed that both lights in Calvert's Garth are working satisfactorily.

So Easter is a time that we need to celebrate, as we remember God is with us in our deepest need, and God gives us life in all its fullness, eternal life. But this life comes through suffering and death. So do have a good celebration at Easter, as we all remember God's eternal life brought to us through Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection.

Dawn Chorus Sat 16th April – start 5:30am

Andy Chapman will be a conducting a Dawn Chorus at Whenby Farm on Saturday 16th April. I hope he has rhythm! The walk will take 2 - 2.5 hours and will cover a mixture of grassland, woodland and the farm's bird food mixes, ponds and scrapes, plus HLS options including breeding bird plots for lapwing and curlew. The diversity of bird life at the farm is very broad as they can offer different environments suited to different species. Andy, who in his spare time is a volunteer for the RSPB, is very knowledgeable at identifying what he hears as well as what he sees.
