Well, we thought Rievaulx Terrace and Ashberry Nature Reserve had a lot to offer, but for a small reserve Jeffrey Bog proved to be a real treasure trove of finds. Two new members joined us for a super morning, the weather was warm and dry which finally brought out the moths & butterflies: there were lots of small moths we couldn't identify but other sightings included the Chimney Sweeper Moth, Small Copper and Small Skipper butterflies. Swathes of Betony added to the beauty of the landscape and other less common plants seen included Hemp Agrimony, Devils Foot Scabious, Common Spotted Orchids and Dropwort. Birds included Lesser White Throat, Reed Bunting and en route at Kirkham Abbey, keen eyes picked up a Spotted Fly Catcher sitting on the bridge.

Dear Friends,

In Genesis Chapter 2 verse 5 it says that "no plant of the field was yet in the earth and no herb of the field had yet sprung up – for the Lord God had not caused it to rain upon the earth." We get a fascinating picture of the creation of the world. Plants and animals were created but plants hadn't started to grow because God had not caused the rain to fall. We get a fascinating insight into the minds of the writer that rain and therefore life was totally dependent upon God. When God sends rain, life can survive and even thrive. When God withholds rain life becomes hard and difficult.

Last Friday was the 15th July which is St. Swithun's day. St Swithun was a bishop of Winchester in the ninth century. He was a pious and educated man. He died on the 2nd July 862 and he was buried in the churchyard as members of his order usually were. About a hundred years after his burial his remains were moved into the church into a tomb on the 15th July. Legend has it that St. Swithun was not best pleased and so he caused it to rain for forty days and forty nights. The legend still remains that if it rains on St. Swithun's day it will continue to rain for forty days and forty nights. It rained last Friday! Possibly this means we will have a wet Summer, and maybe we will complain about it, but we will be able to feed ourselves.

In the horn of Africa it has not rained for two years until just recently. The weather will have been lovely and sunny and warm, but without the rain the crops have failed.
