In October 1969 Alan Farnaby and I turned the handle of a second hand duplicating machine in the vestry of the old Methodist Church to produce the first Village News. It was messy, hands were covered in ink and when produced we had to fold the pages and deliver them through every door in the village. Our thoughts then were "How would people re-act and will we always have enough news to continue doing it every month." The one commitment we knew we had to do every month was put the cover with the 24 local adverts through every door because the advertisers had paid £2 each for this service for a year.

This issue means that commitment has now been met 500 times over the last 41 years 8 months.

WHAT AN ACHIEVEMENT !

It reflects everything that is good about Sheriff Hutton and demonstrates what an active village we have where people will voluntarily give their time and talents in service to others. Over all these years many people have typed, folded, distributed, raised money, given donations and written the news. Every month has been a picture of life in the village then and when you look at the back copies it's our history.

I've been privileged to have been in at the beginning and shared in many changes as new technology became available and affordable. Today the technology has just about passed me but it is in good hands with Richard, Wendy, Brian and Lynne making sure the News comes through your door each month.

The Sheriff Hutton Village News started because it was felt that the village needed a means of communication to tell people what was happening, who may be contacted, and hopefully prevent different activities competing for village support at the same time. This is still the aim and long may it continue to serve this wonderful caring village.

Notices will be put up in the Post Office and Bus Shelters advising on the action to take if dog owners fail to clear up after their dogs. Residents will be encouraged to report these matters to the Dog Warden for Court action to be taken resulting in financial penalties.

Coach Road

The following letter, dated 6th May 2011, was received from the Definitive Map Officer at North Yorkshire County Council:

'Application to add a footpath at Sheriff Hutton Park, Sheriff Hutton, North Yorkshire

Please be advised that the above application was considered by Members of the Planning and Regulatory Functions Sub Committee on 27 April 2011 at the Galtres Centre, Easingwold. At this meeting, after hearing the report from Officers and listening to the views of numerous objectors and supporters of the application, Members authorized the production of an Order recording a public footpath along the full length of the Coach Road. Once this Order has been sealed it will be made available to the public for comment and advertised in a local paper. The Order will be made available for public comment for a period of six weeks. Once this period has expired, if there are no objectors or any objections are subsequently withdrawn, the order will be confirmed thereby recording the public right of way on the Definitive Map. Should there be any unresolved objections the County Council is required to send the order to the Secretary of State for determination.

When the Order is publicised you will receive a copy of it. If you have any queries about the above, please do not hesitate to contact me.'

Renewal of Bus Contracts

A letter was received from Integrated Passenger Transport Business and Environmental Services Department at NYCC and the following paragraph is extracted as being of significant importance to residents:

'On public transport services the County Council's Criteria for financial support is a minimum of three or more passengers per journey on a regular basis and a maximum subsidy per passenger journey of £7.50 with a target to reduce the subsidies to under £5.00. Where journeys do not meet these criteria and potential savings can be made we will not be looking to maintain them'.

Residents are urged to use the bus service to prevent it being discontinued. The motto is 'Use it or Lose it'. Residents are invited to give their comments on these matters to the Clerk or Councillors before the next meeting on 10th June 2011.
