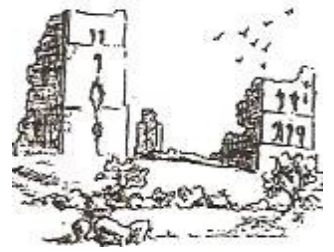

Count Your Blessings for Lent

We usually think we should give something up for Lent - usually sweets, but alcohol sometimes. Once I gave up coffee. It was very hard.

This year, try counting your blessings. Food is a good place to start. Look on the labels to see where your food comes from around the world. I wonder what they are having for breakfast – if they will have more than one meal a day.

We probably take for granted books, crosswords and Sudoku. Yet 16% of the world's population, and 40% of Egyptian women can't read or write. School may be boring but if you are one of the 69 million primary school children who can't go because they have no money, it becomes a privilege not a right. It is a real blessing to read, write and have access to a computer.

And next time you turn a tap on, remember all those who have to walk to collect their water. One billion people do not have clean water. 22nd March is World Water Day, a good time to count our blessings in this department.

We were told that when mains water came to Sheriff Hutton in the 1950's, the farmer who was then in our house at Westfield Farm put in three taps. One was for the house and two for the animals. We have different priorities today.

So count your blessings for Lent. We have a strong community, food, water and the District Hospital down the road... Much to be thankful for.

If you would like to help others less fortunate at this time, then Christina Aid is working in all these areas of education, food provision and health. They would welcome your support.
