The supermobile will visit Sheriff Hutton Village Hall car park between 10.00 and 12.00 on Friday, November 4th and then every fortnight.

What a great October! Two successful events in one month.

One of the warmest days of the year and a record for October, accompanied the group of members that explored Black Toft Sands and North Duffield Carr on the 1st of the month. At Black Toft the treats didn't stop here as a number Marsh Harriers were seen, along with a Merlin which was special, Black Tailed Godwit, Red Shank, Green Shank and Spotted Red Shank, Snipe, Stonechat, Red Admiral butterflies & a low flying Lysander! By the afternoon though all went quiet as the balmy day proved too much for the wildlife and at North Duffield Carr our sightings were limited but did include Linnet, Swallows, Common Data butterfly and a wasp nest above the toilet block.

Our first evening of the winter programme was a lovely way to kick things off. Members shared their summer's stories of wildlife observations which included some wonderful pictures of inside a nesting box. We were walked through the trials and tribulations of a family of blue tits as the parents laid 8 eggs and eventually managed to get 6 chicks to fledge. Other stories included some interesting observations of cat and swan behaviour (not at the same time!); fascinating finds from the Isle of Man: bird survey results done on local farms and bees behaving badly! My thanks goes to Moira, Marion, Dave, Jean and Andy for their contributions.
