Dear Friends,

We have an expression, "Where there's life there's hope." It is quite a common expression and it is quite self explanatory, but it seems that it is tremendously appropriate to the season of Easter. It is very difficult to imagine what Jesus' disciples must have been feeling on Good Friday. All of their hope in the future had been destroyed. They had been on a roller coaster ride with this person called Jesus for three years, and suddenly he was dead and buried. Not only was that very sad and a tremendous blow to them, they also felt that they too were in immediate danger of being killed themselves. Good Friday for the disciples meant "no life and therefore no hope."

Then suddenly from a very unexpected cause, there was life again, and life in a different way, and hope that would soar more than it ever could if Jesus had not died. They started to get reports that Jesus had been resurrected. He was no longer dead but had been raised to life. With new life there was suddenly new hope, and new life when they knew that Jesus had been dead would be a time of amazing hope. This was hope of life beyond death in a very immediate way.

We are used to our changing seasons, where we have Winter, Spring, Summer and Autumn. We are used to thinking of the significance of Jesus' resurrection bringing new life, just as we get new life in the Spring. But this new life from Jesus was not ordinary. It was not the ordinary miracle of new life in the Spring which is expected every year. This was new life from a completely different source. This was God doing something new and unique in the world, it was God demonstrating that God is in charge of life. That also means that God is bringing into the world the most extraordinary and wonderful hope. We have the hope of new life in Christ even through death. Have a Blessed and Peaceful Easter.
