### **Parish Council News**

The Parish Council was held on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> July 2012. It was attended by Cllrs D Wooles (Chairman) (878469), Mrs P Bean (878392), B Parkinson (878373), N Anfield (8787380). Clerk BC Taylor (878060).

County Councillor Clare Wood was present as a guest. One member of the public was present.

### **Report of County Cllr Clare Wood**

She reported that an NYCC Scrutiny Task Group is looking into the use of mobile Vehicle Activated Signs (Speed Matrix) and the opportunity for Parish Councils to lease them on a temporary basis from the County Council at a cost to be agreed. The Task Group will report its findings and recommendations to NYCC Executive on 25<sup>th</sup> September 2012.

It was agreed that the Parish Council should write to the Task Group setting out the case for leasing a matrix.

### **Potholes**

The Clerk reported that he had carried out a tour of all the roads in the Village and had reported 6 areas to NYCC Highways for investigation, namely Castle View, Castle Side, Terrington View, West End, Main Street and North Garth Lane

#### Screening at the Industrial Estate

The latest development is very visible from the road. Lights from the Estate are shining on to the highway and into residents' windows. These matters have been reported to the Ryedale Planning Enforcement Officer who is looking into the matter and also into the proliferation of advertisement hoarding on the highway near to the estate.

#### Dog Fouling

This still continues in the Village. A more detailed notice is in the Village News.

### **Cycle Races**

At least one of the recent cycle races through the Village was not properly notified to the Parish Council. Investigation with the appropriate bodies is taking place.

### **Grass Cutting**

Because of the bad weather the Grass Cutting Contractor has been unable to carry out the normal number of cuts. This is being monitored and the Contractor is being most helpful in the matter and a reduction in his charges will be allowed for.

### **Neighbourhood Watch**

With the exception of some relatively minor incidents during June, all remains quiet in the village, however I am asked by the Police to advise all users and owners of 4x4's (all types and ages, luxury SUV's and utility) to be extra vigilant and security conscious as there have been a surge in thefts of such vehicles in the wider Yorkshire area – ensure they are at least locked, preferably within a locked garage or other secure building. I am further asked to make you aware that the theft of diesel oil is on the rise again, both commercial and domestic. If you see any suspicious activity, please report it immediately to the Police.

The results of the traffic survey to determine the viability of 'Matrix' signs has been, too say the very least, disappointing. Neighbourhood Watch and the Parish Council are currently working together to progress this issue to the next level – I am sure most if not all of you are aware of the dangers presented by speeding vehicles within the village and the desirability of any measures that will reduce the substantial risks imposed on residents and visitors. It would be helpful if you could write to the Parish Council expressing your concerns and/or support for these signs, preferably highlighting any specific incidents you have witnessed or been involved in.

In the unlikely event of summer actually arriving and allowing us to enjoy our gardens, can I please remind you to ensure that valuable and portable items are secured and out of sight, and if you are spending time in the back garden, ensure that the front door is locked (or vice versa!) – Opportunistic crime always increases during the summer months.

As a reminder to all, in the event of you needing to contact the Police for non-emergency matters the new telephone number to use is 101- don't be frightened to use it. All emergency calls are still to be made to 999.
