#### **Womens World Day of Prayer**

#### Dear Friends.

In psalm 46 verse 10 it says, "Be still, and know that I am God." Most of the psalm is about the turbulence of life. It talks about wars and about the whole of nature being uprooted and destroyed. Yet in the midst of all of this turbulence the Psalmist urges us to be still, so that we can know God better.

We live in a very busy time. Most of us wonder how we can manage to get all of the things that we want to do in 24 hours in the day. We have this feeling that we should always be busy. It is as if our life's work is measured by the amount of activity that we fit in. But there is a tremendous power in stillness. There is a tremendous healing in the ability to be able to be still and ponder God's nature.

I saw a brief article in the news about meditation. A reporter spoke to a doctor who was investigating the phenomenon with the latest high technology to see what effect it had. They were looking at a brain scan. When someone meditated they discovered that the chronic pain that they suffered from reduced. The reporter discovered that the front part of the brain, (which is associated with ego) reduced in activity, and the rest of the brain was stimulated. It was a very small sample but it seemed that stillness was not only healing but also draws people out of themselves to think of others.

We are entering the time of Lent in February. It is a time that we traditionally think of as a time to meditate. It is a time to think about our life and our relationship to God. So I invite you all at this time of Lent to read psalm 46. Look at all of the images, and the power of that psalm. But also I invite you to act on verse 10. Be still and know God.
