Election of Officers

Neighbourhood Watch

Firstly an apology regarding last month's entry in the Village News – due to some form of transmission error with an e-mail the text became corrupted and therefore difficult to read. A copy of the document in its intended format is on the shop noticeboard.

Following consultation with Ryedale Police I can advise that locally criminal activity is all but non-existent (with the exception of motorists ignoring speed restrictions / not wearing seat belts etc). Whilst this is excellent news, we all must be aware that as the seasons change, so does the nature of likely crime. Please ensure that your sheds and garages are securely locked and that high value and/or portable garden tools and furniture are kept either secured or out of sight. If you should see anyone acting suspiciously ring 101 immediately.

Typical items subject to theft are lawn mowers, hanging baskets, potted plants, bicycles... if it's PORTABLE it's VULNERABLE. Don't forget that your insurance company will take a dim view of expensive kit being stolen from unsecured locations.

It is my understanding that with regard to speed matrix signs for the village that good progress is being made – reports have been compiled by the Police and myself and recommendations passed on for possible locations – we are now awaiting an evaluation of traffic speeds in the worst affected areas (generally the main road through the village and Cornborough Road/North back Lane).

Information packs relating to Neighbourhood Watch have now been delivered to all houses in Sheriff Hutton – if you have not received a copy, please contact me at the Post Office. I would hope that by the time this has been printed Lilling should also have had their packs.

For anyone wishing to informally speak to our local Police, please note that PCSO Nicki Pounder will be available on 29 June at the village hall between 10.00am and 12.00pm.

As a reminder to all, in the event of you needing to contact the Police for non-emergency matters the new telephone number to use is 101- don't be frightened to use it. All emergency calls are still to be made to 999.

Olympic Torch Relay

George Conway will be carrying the Olympic Torch in Northallerton on Wednesday 20th June. The torch is expected to arrive in Northallerton at approximately 10am. George was nominated by local resident, Ian Holdsworth. George's nomination story is as follows:

"George is 14 years of age and suffers from a rare muscular atrophy, which severely restricts his mobility and confines him to a wheelchair. George is a real positive character and what he lacks in mobility, he more than makes up for through his charming personality and positive attitude to life. Despite his disability, George lives life to the full, often representing his school in sports and activities such as swimming and fishing. In more recent years, George has been heavily involved with the Whizz Kids wheelchair charity as an ambassador. In this role he has attend numerous functions and meetings as a representative of children with disabilities. For example, he recently visited the Houses of Parliament and met with MPs to discuss issues such as the supply of wheelchairs from local authorities. He also spent three days working with other young ambassadors, writing scenarios and filming videos about the discrimination they experienced in their daily lives. The video was produced by O.D.I. (Office for Disabled Issues) to inspire individuals to stand up for their right to participate equally in education and in wider society, and to have a say in decisions that impact on their daily lives. Sadly George lost his mother Rachel to cancer in May 2011. Rachel was a strong, committed and loving wife and mother who worked tirelessly for her family. Her loss has obviously been very hard on George, and his father Shaun and younger sister Eloise. Through this sad time George showed real courage, maturity and strength of character, supporting his family and keeping their spirits up with his infectious positivity. I believe George personifies the Olympic spirit with his determination to make the very best of his life no matter how great the challenge. He is a shining beacon and a role model to all of us and it would make him and everyone that knows him immensely happy and proud if he were to carry the torch on a part of its journey to the Olympic stadium."

Dear All

What is there over the horizon? I have always found the horizon to be a fascinating thing. It is the limit of where we can see. That might vary with the visibility due to the air conditions, but there is always a horizon. When I was a child I grew up in Africa, and you could drive the horizon in any direction and you would always find more land. We were about 2,000 miles from any sea. I once went on a holiday to Lake Malawi, which is the eighth biggest lake in the world. It was not possible to see from the shore that you stood on to the far side. All you could see was water. I have since lived in places in England by the sea where there is a definite horizon at the edge of the sea.

But the horizon marks the furthest extent of our sight. It is a false limit because the further up that we go the further the horizon extends. We have many different horizons in our life. Inside the horizon we find the familiar ground, and the places that we know. Beyond the horizon there is the unknown. Inside our horizons we feel safe and secure, beyond it we step out into the unknown. Beyond our horizon we go to places that we don't know, we meet people that we have not met before.

So what is the horizon of our faith? What is the circle of faith in which we feel everything is familiar? What are we comfortable with because we have seen the limits and stay within them? But the most interesting question is; what lies beyond?

Most of us would be familiar with our own congregations. We would be familiar with our own style of worship. We would be familiar with the people with whom we share fellowship. Beyond that horizon lies evangelism, reaching out to the people who are not familiar. Beyond our horizon lies the unknown, the place that we don't know, and where the reactions of people will be strange, and unfamiliar. So we have a tendency to just keep within our own horizons. We have a fear of the unknown.

The disciples spent time with Jesus and their horizons were widened whilst they were with him. He opened their minds and eyes to things beyond their familiar faith. But then after Jesus' death and resurrection, their horizon suddenly expanded beyond their wildest imaginings. It was as if they were lifted up in an aircraft and could see lands and people beyond all thought. Death is not the end.

How far are we prepared to be lifted up in faith? What horizons might we see from that new perspective? Jesus constantly invites us up a little higher. The question is what holds us back?
