A Grant has been awarded by NYCC and the installation of the new board will be carried out as part of the Bus Stop refurbishment.

Winter Gritting Program

The gritting program is now operational. Because the program is new to us there was a slight delay after clearing half the village due to supplies running out. The Village now has an adequate supply of salt and grit and a reliable source to provide it.

There were difficulties encountered due to cars parked in the road. The Parish Council wish to remind residents to clear their own driveways.

Mobile Library

The mobile library service has been cancelled at short notice on occasions. NYCC have asked for a contact person in the village whom they will notify of cancellations so that a notice can be put on the door of the Village Hall.

Ryedale staff have been busy doing other jobs needed because of the bad weather and brown bin collections have not been carried out. The service should shortly be back to normal once the bad weather is over.

Journeying through Lent

The days lengthen as spring arrives and we journey through Lent to Easter. Just as we prepare the soil for our spring sowings in the garden, so we prepare ourselves for the great Easter festival.

It is with sadness that the Bishop and I have received Sue Nightingale's decision to retire from her ministry in the Forest of Galtres Benefice. Sue's final service will be the Benefice Service for Pentecost, to be held at Westfield Farm, on Sunday 27th May at 11am.

Sue and Nick's hope is that they will move house and live in York.

Sue's retirement will have many implications for both the Vicar and the Parishes. Two immediate implications are:

- Firstly we shall be organising a collection for a Retirement Gift from the villages of our Benefice and a special Farewell Celebration will be held at the Pentecost Service.
- Secondly, the Vicar has arranged a new monthly services plan for all the churches in the Benefice. This will involve some amendments for everybody, as we lose a 'two-thirds clergy (non-paid) post', face a reduction in the contribution of retired clergy, and knit the Benefice churches together in a closer, supportive and enriching partnership. Details of this plan will be relayed to all PCCs for information at their next meeting.
