## Parish Council News

The Parish Council Meeting was held on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> August 2012. It was attended by Councillors D Wooles (Chairman) (878469), B Parkinson (878373), N Anfield (878738) and S Wood (07834493302). Clerk BC Taylor (878060). Apologies were received from Councillor Mrs P Bean (878392). One member of the public was present.

### Speed Matrix:

The NYCC task group are currently carrying out a feasibility study of providing speed matrixes for hire to Parishes. There will be a meeting in September/October to review their report.

### Donations:

Additional donations of £100 each are to be made to St Helen's Church, Ryedale CAB and the Village News to supplement the payments made earlier this year.

### Planting of Jubilee Tree:

Having looked at the costs charged by English Heritage for the planting of the tree on the Glebe, these appeared to be out of proportion to what was intended. It is therefore the Council's view to abandon this plan. However, if any residents wish the Council to proceed with the tree or would like to put forward some alternative suggestions to mark the Jubilee please let your Councillors or Clerk know before the next meeting on 14<sup>th</sup> September 2012.

## Neighbourhood Watch

The last meeting (17 July) was a lively affair, with the guest attendance of two Police Traffic Officers – somewhat inevitably the meeting was largely taken up with discussions on the issues relating to speeding within Sheriff Hutton, Lilling, Flaxton, Thornton Le Clay and Foston. At the time of the meeting the latest information available from County Council was that ‘if the villages wanted to have speed matrix equipment then they should be paid for by their respective Parish Councils’, a rather absurd stance (in my opinion) given that the Police and County Council have responsibility for law enforcement and highway engineering. The option preferred during the meeting was for the procurement/hire of portable Matrix systems to be shared by the villages, with occasional, random, Police activity.

Following the meeting, and prior to further discussions due in September at County Council, the Police have agreed to put in place random speed checks within the villages - these have already commenced, albeit at rather odd times of the day. Be advised that these are intended to use the full force of the law, not necessarily issue a friendly warning.

As you may infer from the above, the issue of speeding is set to continue for a while yet – both the Parish Council and I will keep you informed of any further developments.

Summer has finally arrived – as previously requested; please take care to keep high value and/or portable garden equipment secure.

As a reminder to all, in the event of you needing to contact the Police for non-emergency matters the new telephone number to use is 101- don't be frightened to use it. All emergency calls are still to be made to 999.

The next meeting is scheduled for 13 November at 7.00pm in the village hall, Sheriff Hutton. Anyone interested in joining the scheme as a coordinator should contact either Alan Pitman at the Post Office in Sheriff Hutton or by calling Chris Hudson on 01347 878389.

This would increase buying power and therefore reduce fuel bills. Once requirements are known, the oil companies are contacted, and the company that produces the lowest quote is used.

## Defibrillator for Sheriff Hutton

Dear Villagers we are delighted to announce that after several months of discussions we are able to announce that the Yorkshire Ambulance Service have agreed to fund an AED (defibrillator) for the village of Sheriff Hutton, this would be located in a central location for easy access. They have requested that the device be provided in conjunction with a trained team of first responders who can provide additional support prior to attendance of the ambulance personnel. Any persons interested in acting as first responders need to fulfil the following criteria:

- Over 18 years of age
- less than 3 penalty points on their driving licence
- be willing to undergo an occupational health check and
- have an enhanced criminal records bureau assessment (eCRB)
- additionally be available for 4 hours a week voluntary duty.

## **St Leonard's Summer Banquet**

A very sincere thank you to everyone who supported the St Leonard's Summer Banquet on August 5<sup>th</sup>. We do appreciate your help and generosity which enabled us to achieve the fantastic figure of over £5,000.

We are raising the money to replace the life-expired heating system which will not be certified for use beyond mid-2014. We have, therefore, 18 months to fund and replace the heating installed 47 years ago. If we do not achieve this the church will lose its electrical certification and thus its heating, lighting and organ.
