Starting with welcome drinks and canapés, we moved to a huge barn which was very attractively laid out and enjoyed a range of cold meats, salads, desserts, cheese and biscuits, finishing with coffee, tea and mints. Many thanks to Eric and his generous friends and members of the history group for donating, preparing and serving the food!

A very big thank you to all who contributed towards the prizes for the auction. These included 2 x half lambs from Stuart Stark from Fridlington Farms Ltd, a family day ticket to Castle Howard House and Grounds, a bottle of whisky from the House of Commons donated by MP Ann Mackintosh, and a last minute Aromatherapy Massage donated by one of the guests. Thanks to Melanie for organising and running this auction which raised over £250. There was also a £50 note donated by Eric which was 'raffled' raising £300.

The total of almost £2,500.00 for this event has now raised our dedicated Archive Room Building Fund to just over £6,000.00 in the last 14 months. Many thanks to everyone who has helped us to reach this fantastic figure. We are working towards a total of £14,400.00. If we keep going at this rate we may be able to start building by next summer!

At our July group meeting we welcomed another new member. The group were fascinated by the contents of one box which held the results of a village survey carried out in 2000. There were photographic records of all the properties in the village, where possible including the residents. A simple census type survey lists all residents with ages, occupations, etc. Many comments were made about changes that had taken place, people who have left the village or sadly died, and changes to properties were also noted, although only the front elevation was shown. John Hendry has provided a summary of the national census taken in 2001 showing 1038 people in the village and giving a breakdown by age, sex, economic activity etc. This will roughly correlate with our 2000 figures and adds interest to the exercise.

We were able to partly furnish it and make it homely for him before the final move. He did get very stressed about the move beforehand as we expected and displayed this in a number of different ways. But he settled very quickly when he met the little girl next door.

We know that a lot of people have been very concerned for us over the last year, and we are very grateful for the love and support that many people have shown. Things will still be difficult until I manage to find another job or manage to start making money in a new business, which takes some time to get going. But we are very grateful for people's prayers and concerns for us over this difficult transition. Please keep praying for us.

#### **Neighbourhood Watch**

June and July have been locally quiet, the Police reporting nothing of note in the period, however I would urge all of you making the most of the current summer weather (current at the time of writing!) to take care to ensure valuable/portable garden items are safely locked away when not in use, and to take necessary measures to ensure your property is secure when not occupied – open windows are an invitation to burglars, and in light of the burglaries reported last month (in Slingsby and Hovingham) it would be wise to be cautious.

Following a number of complaints made to me regarding the roundabout at the top of Dasket Hill in Sheriff Hutton being used by cycling clubs as a start/finish point, in doing so creating a distraction at an already apparently hazardous junction, I have discussed the issue with the Police, who advise that the clubs are entitled to proceed. Whilst I disagree with the logic and the principles involved, there is nothing that can be done to halt this arrangement. I would, however, welcome any information regarding hazardous incidents involving racing cyclists or the supporters/spectators in the vicinity of the roundabout.

There has been one report of cold calling (on the 16 July) in the village, this time someone from Tyneside selling/offering driveway surfacing – this was reported to the Police by at least one householder – at the time of writing I am not aware if the Police were able to attend and/or take any action.

I have been asked to assess the possibility of extending the speed limit on the Lilling to Flaxton Road – I will be writing to NYCC shortly to see whether this is a viable proposition and will advise of the response in next month's village news.

As previously requested, can all road users be aware of increased usage of the area's roads by walkers, horse-riders and cyclists and take due care, especially in the evenings.

The next NHW meeting was tentatively booked for 2<sup>nd</sup> December, however the Police would not be able to attend – I have been asked to move to 3<sup>rd</sup> December (a Tuesday). If this is a problem for the regular attendees of the meeting, please contact me as soon as possible and I will attempt to reschedule.
