A trip to Howsham Mill proved rewarding for the group with sightings of a red kite and a kingfisher as well as a rich biodiversity of plant life including butterbur and the first sightings this year of red campion and meadowsweet. The Howsham Mill Project is in the process of restoring the Mill to its original state, for use as an environmental study centre promoting renewable energy and local history and wildlife. It is well worth a visit.

Next month's visit on Saturday 6th July is a day trip to Pocklington Canal. This restored canal is 9.5 miles long with a towpath that runs the entire length. It can be uneven in places and muddy in wet weather, so bring suitable shoes or boots. It is a particularly good place to see dragonflies and damselflies. Thus far May and June have been locally very quiet, with nothing of note to report in Sheriff Hutton or any of our near villages, however there have been burglaries in Slingsby and Hovingham that are giving Police cause for concern, and I include towards the bottom of this report a request for information issued by the Police.

Insofar as I am aware there have been no instances of Cold Calling in this period, with the exception of one opportunistic gentleman who was (genuinely) unaware of the applied status and who promptly left the village.

I am advised that due to a number of 'issues' the speed matrix systems should be installed towards the end of summer, however the initial installation of the 'locating spigots' has now been completed, so at least some progress has been made.

Can I ask all drivers to take extra care, particularly in the evenings, as there is a significant increase in cyclists in the area, presumably doing time trials of some sort, some of whom appear to cycle with scant regard for their own safety or for that of other road users.

Memory and Myth (1) – from the Village Archive

Fact or fancy, memory or myth – these are the ingredients of folk lore, and we spent much of 1975 searching records and turning back the pages of local memory came across a fascinating variety of lore which we recount for interest, if not always for acceptance.

Elderly minds naturally vary in clarity, and this same incident can often be clothed in different guise. We will always remember with pleasure the kind and courteous way in which we were received by two very elderly gentlemen who have recently died, and the general willingness of established residents to talk to us about days gone by. In addition to all the architectural information which has been embodied in the Heritage Folios and which was illustrated at the October Exhibition, you may be interested to read some of the results of conversations which came as a bonus, a side-product of our more serious purpose. Myth or memory, fancy or fact, they shall be recorded rather than be lost forever.

"A big windmill stood on the hill above Mill lane" we were told. "It had very large sails. Fred Bell had it, and used the same mill house as today. Farmers took their grain to be ground. Pearson had a stone mill at Chapel Farm. Groves the tinsmith's place adjoined The Packhorse (*now The Highwayman*). His father 'Tinker' Groves won £100 for running a foot race. There was a lodging house at the top of the hill near the Castle Inn. Men would stay there, going from one town to another seeking work. Men also stayed at the Barracks (*Bracken Hill*), and there were eight sort-of apartments where they stayed." This could have been in the days of the Foss Navigation, when the bargees would need overnight accommodation. "Ale was brewed there, and there was a big cellar below the house. Grain used to be carried up the stairs on a man's back. It was stored on the top floor."

"Castle Farm house used to be thatched, but there was a big snowstorm and they came down. I remember the new farmhouse being built. The old house was near the stackyard. There was a pinfold near the entrance, and a fee had to be paid when lost animals were retrieved. I remember when Rose Dene was thatched. Carriers were Hull, Calvert and Ward. John Purdy kept Manchester House, also Hutchinson and Armitage. My mother used to do dressmaking and was paid 1/- (5p) for making a shirt."

"A large cruckhouse, thatched, stood where the Institute now stands (now where Moat House is, opposite The Highwayman). Mr Cattle lived there. The rent dinners were held in the old barn behind The Packhorse in a good big room with a fireplace in it, at the top of the outside steps."

"I regularly attended steeplechases on different farms. 'Tal' Ridsdale (Alfred) lived at Cape Farm."

These recollections are presented as they were told to Edith Kennewell and other members of the Womens' Institute when they were researching the Sheriff Hutton Treasure Survey in 1975, and as recorded by Edith Kennewell.
