A little archaeology...

I am aware that there is a considerable local awareness of, and interest in, local history, so I thought at least some readers might be interested to know that a series of flint artefacts I have recovered from just outside the village have been confirmed by the Portable Antiquities team at the Yorkshire Museum as being from the Mesolithic period (after the last ice-age, before the adoption of agriculture). Sites of this period are quite rare and not easily identified – as far as I am aware the earliest finds made thus far within the Parish date from the Neolithic, so the finds could take the population of this area back to around 8000 or more years ago (accurate dating without organic matter is somewhat subjective).

I would be interested to hear suggestions from local groups/organisations as to how these finds might be stored and/or displayed within the village once they have been returned to me. Alan Pitman 15 October 2013.
