Housing Needs Survey in Sheriff Hutton

A housing needs survey will be conducted in the parish of Sheriff Hutton during September to see if there is a need for affordable homes for local people. The survey is being done by Ryedale District Council and is fully supported by Sheriff Hutton Parish Council.

Questionnaires will be distributed to all households in the parish during the middle of September and a pre-paid envelope is included for return of forms. When such surveys are undertaken, it is vital that all households in housing need respond by completing the questionnaires. Without this evidence of people's needs, then affordable housing schemes which could help keep open vital community services such as schools and shops cannot be built.

People who have had to move away from the village due to a lack of affordable housing, either to rent or to buy, can also be included in the survey as long as they have a strong local connection to the parish.

The Rural Housing Enabler will collate the results of the survey and report this back to the Parish Council. The information given will be confidential and only used as part of a statistical report. Once the results are known, should a need for local needs housing be identified, RDC together with the Parish Council will look to address any needs highlighted in the survey. This will include opportunities for discussion of any plans for new housing with the community.

Sheriff Hutton Field Naturalists September 2013

A trip to Potteric Carr was a simply stunning day out for the Field Naturalists Group. This, the flagship reserve of the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust, covers over 200 hectares of diverse habitats providing a home for a wealth of flora and fauna. The group spotted over fifty different types of plant and twenty different birds including Kingfishers, Plovers and Sand pipers in between enjoying a hearty lunch at the reserve's Kingfisher Tea Rooms.

Next month's visit on Saturday 7th September is to Garbutt Wood near Sutton Bank, another nature reserve of the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust. Garbutt Wood is a woodland site offering spectacular views and is home to many birds and butterflies and is part of the Sutton Bank National Park area. There is a visitors' centre but you may want to bring a pack-up if you plan to stay any length of time. Footpaths are steep so good walking shoes are a must. Farlington Village Speeding and Incident Black Spot

Residents of Farlington have noticed an increase in drivers of cars, lorries and agricultural vehicles speeding through the village. This is particularly evident on the road from Stillington to Sheriff Hutton. The road outside of the properties Ashbrook House and Ashbrook Barns bends and narrows considerably here and a protruding curb exacerbates the problem. There have been several near misses on these bends in particular due to vehicles travelling too fast and not anticipating oncoming traffic. The Highways Agency is going to be increasing road signage at this point but are reluctant to relocate the 30 mph signs to further outside the village. We need to collate more information on incidents occurring at this black spot and I would like to ask that anyone either involved in an incident, near miss, or observing such, please let me know providing brief details of the nature of incident, date and time. Neighbourhood Watch

July and August have been relatively quiet in the area, the only noteworthy incidents being two lots of cold callers reported, both of which I understand are being dealt with by NYCC Trading Standards, however the Police advise that there has been a spate of thefts of red and white diesel from the Helmsley area, amounting to a significant total, with one theft alone reported as 1000 litres. As the nights start to draw in and you stock up on heating oil, be aware that your oil is both valuable and vulnerable, and take whatever precautions you can to safeguard your tank. Please, if you see anything suspicious, ring the Police straight away.

The initial approach to NYCC regarding speed restrictions approaching Lilling from Flaxton has been, somewhat surprisingly, rejected out of hand. I will be further discussing the issue with Parish Council and residents in the area to determine what more can be done to move the issue forward.

Following my request last month for information regarding hazardous incidents involving the cycle racing centred on the Dasket Hill roundabout, I have had a number of people report 'close shaves' with cyclists, but perhaps of greater concern is a report that the road had actually been partially coned-off during a race. If anyone happens to see a repeat of this I would ask that they at least photograph the scene and contact the Police.

As harvest-time is nearly upon us again, the Police advise that there is an increased likelihood of poachers becoming active again, and they ask that any suspicious activity be reported to them in the usual way.

The next NHW meeting will be held on 3rd December, NOT the 2nd as tentatively booked during the last meeting, the date being changed to suit Police shift patterns. My apologies for the change, however if any of the regular attendees have problems with this revised date, can you please contact me as soon as possible and I'll try to accommodate your requirements.
