Planning Applications for consideration

14/00197/FUL – Erection of a 3 bedroom detached dwelling with attached garage and associated parking/amenity space following demolition of existing outbuilding at Land East of Stone Lodge, Main Street, Sheriff Hutton for Mr D J Weston & Mrs H P Spath. Wish to see refused. The property would cause additional vehicle movements over the village green where access problems already exist and would be aggravated by this development. A letter of objection had been received from a resident.

Ryedale District Council – Decisions and Appeals None received.

Public Forum No members of the public were present.

Parking & Grass Verges

Councillors Bean & Dodd had met with NYCC Highways onsite in the village to discuss any possible solutions to the damage to the grass verges by parked cars. NYCC Highways did not have any funds to implement any solutions but would write to the Parish Council as soon as possible. Residents are asked to park carefully to prevent further damage to the verges. The grass cutting contractors would be asked if it may be possible to in some way notify car owners before cuts are due.

Dog Bin

The Clerk would obtain a quote for an additional new dog bin for the Conservation Area. Dog poo bags would also soon be available from the Village Store.

Benches

The Oak Bench on Main Street had been removed for repair and the bench on Mill Lane would be removed for repair soon.

At the village auction, we will happily sell all sorts of good quality household and garden items, including furniture, sports equipment, kitchen utensils, tools, paintings etc. This is always a very enjoyable and entertaining afternoon, with INCREDIBLE bargains and wonderful catering!

Neighbourhood Watch

Thankfully (at the time of writing, at least) there have been no further instances of burglary or other misdeeds reported in the area over the past month. There have been, however, two more instances of cold-calling at the beginning of March in Sheriff Hutton. To my knowledge neither were called in to the Police or Trading Standards so no action has been taken to prevent these characters returning. I must stress the importance of calling 101 as soon as a cold-caller leaves your door – the call won't take long and the operators of the lines are helpful and efficient. The effectiveness of the No-Cold-Calling-Zone relies upon the villagers being responsive – reporting the instance to me one or two days after the 'call', whilst instructive, does not enable the Police to react effectively.

A couple of years ago I asked for the practice of dumping dog waste in the castle moat area to cease, and so it did, however I have been asked to point out that the problem has once again started. I have also had a complaint from a resident of The Square that 'bags' were being discarded in his garden. This is a small community, a relatively large proportion of whom are dog-owners, all of who should know well enough to pick up after their dog and dispose of the waste responsibly. As the tourist season picks up in the weeks ahead I dread to think what impression people will take away of a village that tolerates this behaviour. If you see anyone discarding dog waste inappropriately please call Ryedale District Council (01653 600666) and report it – there is a significant fine to be levied on those responsible. I do hope this is the last time NHW gets involved in this 'issue'.
