Planning Applications for consideration

13/01461/FUL – Siting of two bedroom timber cabin for use as a temporary rural workers dwelling to include formation of access track and hardstanding, and provision of a domestic curtilage (retrospective application) at Land at Cornborough Road, Sheriff Hutton for Mrs L Banks. **To be considered at an additional meeting on 24 January 2014 at 7.30pm.**

Public Forum

Several members of the public attended and gave their views on the current development taking place on Cornborough Road.

Parking

A request had been received from a potential future resident for information on garages or driveways available to rent for their two vehicles. If you do have a driveway or garage you do not use and would be willing to rent out please let the Clerk know and he will keep a list of those available as this may ease some of the on-street parking issues.

Industrial Estate

North Yorkshire County Council had replied to one of the Industrial Estate tenants stating that the lack of white lines was a method of reducing the speed of the vehicles and that a sign could be erected by the developer asking motorists to drive slowly.

Affordable Housing Survey

Colin Huby, the Rural Housing Enabler for Ryedale District Council would be coming to the February meeting to discuss the results of the recent affordable housing needs survey.

Speed Matrix

Disappointment was expressed at the lack of data available from the last speed matrix deployment and the Council would ask North Yorkshire County Council for an additional deployment at no cost and that in future the data be collected by additional loggers.

Re: An Evacuee Remembers

The article in January's News was so evocative of my childhood in the village, I felt prompted to reply. Gerry Grinham was our cousin and lived with his Mam and Dad and brother, Teddy, on Lobley Terrace at the top of the village green, and I too enjoyed sledging down it on our home-made sledge. My Uncle Bill did catch moles and I used to gaze at them in horrified fascination. I too liked the Pearson brothers and their sister Bessie who faithfully cared for their Mother who lived to a very grand old age.

The grass verges were not trimmed in those days and cows and goats grazed on the long grass by the road side. As we had a stile from our garden into the castle grounds I also spent many happy hours round the castle and moats, it was a more wild adventure playground then. What wonderful recall your correspondent has. I too remember sitting in the village church and gazing at the banners and the wolf's skin and making up stories if the sermon was a bit long. As I was only three in 1941 I don't remember Chris but I do remember the evacuees and their classroom in the old Chapel Sunday school vestry.

Thank you for giving me the chance to relive some very happy memories of a country childhood. The Sheriff Hutton of my childhood had a wealth of interesting characters and secret places which kept my imagination alive. Later as a teacher with a little story tellers licence the children waited with bated breath for the next school assembly and the latest Sheriff Hutton story.

Neighbourhood Watch

The Police advise that there have been two recent burglaries in Hovingham. In one of these the thieves made use of the householders own ladders to gain access to the property – giving credence to last month's cautionary comments on securing ladders out of sight of intruders. There have been no further burglaries in Sheriff Hutton or adjacent villages in the past month.

We have had one incidence of cold-calling in the past month, involving a small group of men selling goods from holdalls. The Police were called in and the individuals were subsequently escorted from the area. I have asked the Police to contact two of the double-glazing companies that regularly flout the NCCZ to ensure that we have no further 'visitations'. As always, if you have a cold-calling incident please do not hesitate to ring it in to 101 – the process is really very straightforward and painless, don't be afraid to ring!

On a disturbing note, I have been made aware of a domestic cat that has been hit by airgun pellets (yes, more than one). If anyone has any information on this subject, please let the Police (or me) know, quickly.

I had a number of messages regarding the activities of three individuals in a white transit van acting suspiciously between Lilling and Terrington earlier this week – for those of you involved, be advised that the registration details provided enabled the Police to identify the van as belonging to 'travellers', who have now moved on.

Data from the speed matrix sign's last period of residence will NOT be being made available for scrutiny. Having read the exchange of letters between our Parish Council and NYCC on the subject I can only praise the Parish Council for their restraint. Another farcical foul-up. Unbelievably NYCC have elected to emplace the 'road based strip' method to record traffic speeds during the current session of matrix placement, despite the previous results from the method being deemed unsatisfactory. That the signs are capable of capturing, storing and distributing digital data is apparently irrelevant. Astonishing. I will attempt to obtain data-sets from either NYCC or SWARCO (the supplier of the signs), though I suspect that the usual delays and obfuscation will hinder progress.

The usual warnings from the Police remain active regarding theft of heating oil, securing property against burglary and the likelihood of poaching activity locally,
