#### **Planning Applications for consideration**

There were no plans received.

#### **Ryedale District Council – Decisions and Appeals**

13/01461/FUL – Siting of two bedroom timber cabin for use as a temporary rural workers dwelling to include formation of access track and hard-standing, and provision of a domestic curtilage (retrospective application) at Land at Cornborough Road, Sheriff Hutton for Mrs L Banks. **Refused**.

#### **Public Forum**

Three members of the public were present. Village Green and North Yorkshire County Council matters were discussed. It was agreed that a village inspection would be undertaken at the beginning of July to ascertain whether any matters could be addressed by the Parish Council. It was also agreed that a letter would be written regarding an issue of residents of a particular property parking on the green.

#### **Dog Fouling**

There had been an increase in the last few months of dog fouling on Cornborough Road, Main Street and near the Church. Several new dog bins have been fitted by the Parish Council over the last eighteen months and these should be used in conjunction with dog bags.

#### **Matrix Sign**

A report had been received from North Yorkshire County Council showing that the speed matrix sign deployments had reduced traffic speeds by at least 5%. One more deployment would be done and then the Parish Council would review the effectiveness of the signs.

## **Village War Memorial Research**

As mentioned in earlier issues, I have been researching the names of the people who appear on our Village War Memorials. The main research is now being edited ready for publishing. Although the findings will be published in a book, I am sure that more information will arise as time goes on, so this will not be the complete story. We know that as well as those women and men who died in service there were over a hundred more who went off to the war. That would probably be between 15% and 20% of the men from the village at the time.

There are a few people on the memorials that have been difficult to track down. If anyone has information that would help to build our Village War Memorial story please contact me to share. In particular I am looking for information about:

**William Bray**. I have found 6 possible men of that name in the right regiment. The person who was born nearest to Sheriff was a William Bray born at Whenby. His next of kin are given as grandparents in Suffolk.

There are others that it would be good to have more information about and perhaps pictures. For example, it would be good to have more information about:

**William Albert Payne**. He seems to have been known by either of his first names. He possibly had brothers called Thomas, George and John and sisters called Sarah and Clara.

**Tom Richardson** whose family lived near the Castle Inn where his father was a brewer at one point. He had six brothers and sisters and seems to have married just before he went to war.

Robert Haines from High Roans Farm on the Strensall Road. He had 3 brothers and sisters.

## **Neighbourhood Watch**

Whilst I have had no reports of 'cold-callers' in the past month, I can report that in an incident possibly related to earlier cold-calling, an elderly local resident has been the victim of a scam whereby she was told by visiting 'workmen' that her gutters required cleaning out. On completion of this task she was presented with a bill of nigh on a thousand pounds, and warned that broken guttering needed to be replaced at the same value. The perpetrators of this scam were using a white transit-type van with mobile telephone numbers on the side, the preferred mode of transport for that section of the community that live in caravans and don't pay tax (go on, work it out). Thankfully this incident was reported to the Police by a sharp-eyed resident and is, I believe, resolved. Although this has had a reasonable outcome, it should, I hope, reinforce the importance of reporting future incidences of cold-calling PROMPTLY to the Police. Further, please can neighbours of elderly/vulnerable people be alert to suspicious activity. If you are living on your own, I know it's difficult for many of you to 'just shut the door', however courtesy/politeness can be construed as weakness and vulnerability to the unscrupulous. If in doubt call the Police or get neighbourly assistance.

I have had a report of a gate being tampered with in Laurels Garth (Sheriff Hutton), an apparent attempt to gain entry to the rear of the property. Nothing was taken, nor any damage done, however the owner echoes my concern that this attempt was made in broad daylight in a residential area.

Summer is finally upon us. Hot days, warm nights.... Remember that an open window or door is an invitation to a burglar. That cool draught could prove expensive, especially if your insurance company finds out. Another seasonal hazard is due to befall us all – cyclists. Hundreds of them. I understand that Sheriff Hutton is on the route for a number of 'time-trials' (not races, they require road closures). Whilst I am sure that there are no end of benefits associated with these trials, I can't immediately think of any. Based on previous years' experiences bear in mind that the gaggles of lycra-clad racers have scant regard for the laws of the road or their own safety. If you do see anything particularly hazardous, please contact the Police. Take photos if possible/practical/safe to do so. If you ride horses be aware of the timing and route of these trials and consider whether it is safe to ride.

I am in receipt of a detailed table of speed data from NYCC, for which I thank them. These clearly show that speeding is not really an issue within the village which is obviously a relief. An enormous surprise, too, based on personal and reported experience(s). I may report back later on the issue.
