Local Sites Document

Charlotte Bogg, the Managing Development Officer from Ryedale District Council spoke about the local sites document which shows sites for residential development and how this would now be reviewed to form part of the Local Plan. Public consultation would take place before the end of the year. There was a requirement for about 300 properties across the 10 service villages of which Sheriff Hutton was one.

The Council stressed their concern over any possible development of Peckitt's Yard site which had been included in the development officer's briefing. Their concern included

- 1. The visual impact on the Church and East End
- 2. Access to the site over already congested roads where parking problems are ongoing.
- 3. The type of housing envisaged.

Neighbourhood Watch

August and September to date have been relatively quiet locally, with the exception of a burglary and car theft from Claxton and a notable increase in the instances of poaching in the areas surrounding Sheriff Hutton. The Police ask that you dial 999 if you see poaching in progress, and urge you not to approach the individuals involved.

I've had a number of reports of speeding locally, mostly from traffic heading along York Road, sometimes at idiotic speeds. I have requested that one of the 'camera vans' be deployed sporadically over the next couple of months or so and have agreed suitable locations and times. Naturally, nobody reading this exceeds the speed limit so it should cause no problems for locals.

Bonfire night is rapidly approaching – last year I had a number of complaints, mostly from dog owners, about the duration of the 'celebratory' period. Having had dogs that got stressed by fireworks I can sympathise – some of the 'domestic' displays over recent years would appear to be inspired by the 'Shock and Awe' assault on Baghdad a while back. This year the 5th of November is on a Wednesday, thereby potentially displays could be laid on the weekend prior, on the Wednesday or the following weekend, 10 days of misery for some dogs and their owners – I know it's not within the remit of NHW, however I would ask that displays be limited to the 5th and 8th November. Just a thought.

Whilst there have been no local thefts of fuel oil recently it is worth remembering that many people have filled their tanks with oil in anticipation of the colder nights ahead – please be aware of any suspicious activity and call the Police if appropriate. As previously requested, can all tank users review security measures to prevent theft.
