Ryedale District Council has now received written confirmation from Lightsource that the remaining planting will be carried out in October/November 2016 and the seeding in August/September 2016. This will be carried out as per an approved planting plan which has been agreed by the RDC Tree & Landscape Officer.

# **Affordable Housing in Sheriff Hutton**

Residents in Sheriff Hutton had the chance to air their views about an affordable housing proposal in the village last month at an Open Event held in the Village Hall.

A public consultation open day on the issue was held at the Village Hall in Sheriff Hutton on Tuesday 24 May from 1pm to 7pm. An opportunity was also given to the Parish Council to view the plans an hour before the actual event started and several councillors attended.

The proposal is to build 12 two and three bedroom affordable properties at the end of Mill Lane, some for rent and some for shared ownership. Priority would be given to local people with a connection to Sheriff Hutton parish.

Over 80 people came to the event to view the plans with 39 choosing to comment on the proposal. 37 people thought the site was suitable for the development with the same number also supporting an affordable housing development in the village. Many people said that this type of affordable scheme for local people was just what the village needed.

York Housing Association will now look to submit a planning application towards the end of June and if permission is granted, then the development could commence at the beginning of 2017.

# **Sheriff Hutton Field Naturalists July 2016**

The recent cold spell meant that not all the orchids were in bloom at Wharram Quarry but it was still a fascinating visit to this rich chalk grassland site. Common spotted, pyramidal and bee orchids are on site here as well as a wealth of other wild flowers providing food and habitat for many species of butterfly. The group were particularly pleased to spot a Dingy Skipper as these are one of the less sighted species there.

Our next meeting will be on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> July, when we will be visiting Jeffry Bog. Please meet at the Highway Pub car park at 10am. This trip will be a return visit; we visited here about 4 years ago and found it to be rich in wild flowers and butterflies. This is another Yorkshire Wildlife Trust reserve at Kirkham Gorge, near Westow. This site is another remote one with no amenities and the walk might go over into the afternoon, so bringing something to eat and drink is advised.
