

16/00975/HOUSE Greystones, The Green, Sheriff Hutton

Installation of replacement UPVC casement windows to all existing windows to include patio doors to side elevation together with formation of new doors to front and rear elevations.

Erection of a four bedroom agricultural workers dwelling with parking and amenity areas (outline approval 13/00494/OUT dated 17.06.2013 refers).

Change of use of office building to 7 no apartments.

Prior Approval REFUSED – The local planning authority considers that the likely impacts of noise from activities connected with the operation of commercial premises elsewhere on Sheriff Hutton Industrial Estate will give the rise to adverse impact of noise on the intended occupiers of the development. Please note: the Parish Council were not consulted on this application due to it being covered under permitted development.

Coach Road Appeal

Following the further public enquiry held on 14/15/16th June the Inspector's decision has now been received. The following is an extract:

"Order Ref: FPS/P2745/7/48M

This order is made under Section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (the 1981 Act) and is known as the North Yorkshire County Council Public Footpath 25.85/43 Sheriff Hutton and Public Footpath 25.85/44 Sheriff Hutton Modification Order 2011

The order is dated 14th October 2011 and proposes to modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by adding two footpaths running along a route known as the Coach Road, Sheriff Hutton, as shown on the Order Map and described in the Order Schedule.

In accordance with Paragraph 8(2) of the Schedule 15 to the 1981 Act I have given notice of my proposal to confirm the Order with modifications to delete part of one of the Order routes and to amend references to gates.

Summary of Decision: The Order is confirmed subject to the modifications that I proposed previously.

In short the Inspector's decision confirms the order for the Coach Road from points:- A to I on the map but not from Point I to M.

Sheriff Hutton History Group

We enjoyed a fascinating illustrated talk by Richard Atkinson, a graphic designer at Rowntrees for 40 years, at our June meeting.

The company started in a small shop in Walmgate in 1725. The factory moved to the site we know today in 1890. Joseph Rowntree, a Quaker, cared deeply about the welfare of his workers and introduced a pension scheme, a company magazine, Yearsley swimming pool, Homestead Park, a model village for employees at Earswick, and a health recovery and rest home at Scarborough.

At its peak Rowntrees employed 14000 workers from York and around.

Seebom Rowntree inherited Rowntrees from his father, and in 1923 the company amalgamated with John Mackintosh to become Rowntree Mackintosh. Products which became household names include Black Magic, Aero, Dairy Box, Smarties, Rolos, Polos and Kit Kat of which 6 million are still manufactured every day today.

Richard described the development of graphic design from the hand crafted products of the 1960`s to the computer generated designs of today.

Rowntrees was bought by Nestles in 1988 for £2.5 billion.

Glebe Conservation Area

The more observant of the regular walkers of the Glebe may have noticed what at first sight might appear as wanton reduction in the spectacular white flowers of the hogweed. If left to run to seed, which it is now in the process of setting, the whole area will become dominated by just this one plant, at the expense of all the other less visible but vital components of the meadow. So gradually, starting at the west end, we are trying at least to stop more hogweed growing.
