Erection of single storey rear extension extending 3.5m from the rear wall of the original dwellinghouse and having an eves height of 3m and a max height of 3.5m. Refused.

Fracking

After a unanimous vote the Parish Council agreed that they do not wish to see fracking in Ryedale and as such passed a motion to declare the village of Sheriff Hutton 'anti-fracking'. Many concerns were raised including the lack of a clear, formal process relating to any application of fracking, a lack of a detailed consideration of the potential environmental impacts on the countryside, the lack of safeguards to protect individuals who in the future may find it impossible to insure their properties or have the value of their properties reduced, the noise and disturbance to residents the work would create, the effect fracking would have on future generations, the fact it is not a renewable, green energy and the impact fracking would have on the area as a whole. The Clerk has issued the motion to Ryedale District Council and North Yorkshire County Council.


