Revelations in the Churchyard!

Sharp-eyed dog walkers might have noticed two significant pieces of work in the churchyard which have revealed interesting historical building work. First on the north side, the preparatory work for the development of Peckitt's Yard involving the removal of many trees and undergrowth has uncovered the partly hidden medieval ossuary (used as a plant store) which now stands out like a "Wendy house".

On the south side, alongside the public footpath, clearance of ivy and brambles has uncovered the C19th mausoleum of Edward Thompson, of Sheriff Hutton Hall, and his wife Lady Mary, daughter of the 5th Earl Fitzwilliam of Wentworth Woodhouse, born May 2nd 1810 and died May 15th 1893, together with other family graves.

Over the years there had been evidence of misuse by youngsters gathering to share cans of drink and tales of young villagers using it as a den ("witches' coven") but its uncovering has been widely welcomed. Recent clearance work has revealed banks which are covered in primroses and daffodils and other plants in season. The five meter wide circle of cut sandstone raised on substantial foundations, was originally surmounted by iron railings and a gate, probably removed in WW2 for scrap.

All gravestones (where legible) are fully recorded in photographs, text and location by the York Family History Society and a summary is available on the visitors' desk in church. RT

Neighbourhood Watch

As I reported last month, "Community Speedwatch" has been approved for Sheriff Hutton, in view of the current speeding problem. A team of local volunteers is required, to be trained to operate "Speed Guns", and persons observed to be exceeding the speed limit will be reported to the Police. As yet insufficient volunteers have come forward, anyone wishing to take part in this scheme, please get in touch with me. The scheme has been very successful in Pannal, near Harrogate, and is now operating in Weaverthorpe, and it would be a pity to lose the opportunity to crack down speeding here.

Fixed speed cameras are not employed in North Yorkshire, in favour of mobile units, which are more effective, giving better random coverage of problem locations. A further six "State of the Art" vehicles have now been commissioned, which can also identify antisocial driving, such as the use of mobile phones on the move, have automatic number plate recognition, and a longer operating range to further improve coverage. This is not a problem if you comply with the speed limit !
