Golden Anniversary of an Annual Village Celebration *The* New Year Party

On Saturday 7th January 2017 we will be holding a very special party in honour of the older members of our community. The United Christian Churches Committee (UCCC) was founded in 1966 with a remit to provide a free New Year Party in 1967 for elderly residents in Sheriff Hutton, Lilling and Stittenham. Now, fifty years later, the party is still going strong.

The first parties took place in the old Village Hall, which used to be opposite the Highwayman. This involved constructing a stage incorporating a huge snooker table with two big tables on top, just to fit everyone in! Many features of the party have remained the same: we still deliver teas out for anyone who is too poorly to attend, and each guest is still given half a dozen (free range) eggs at the end. At some point the committee daringly decided to add Lollo Rosso (dark red lettuce) to the salad, and have now even swapped to butter dishes and bread rolls (instead of sitting and buttering 16 loaves of bread). The recent addition of a glass of wine has been very well received and we now have more gluten free/vegetarian options available.

The committee continue to personally deliver invitations between Christmas and New Year, ensuring that everyone over 60 has at least one visitor during that time. However, '60' is the new '40' so it's not unusual for some potential guests to be away skiing that weekend.....

We have had so many great nights of entertainment – from brass bands to choirs to the 'homegrown' acts provided by very talented villagers and friends. Who could forget Jim Day, Dick Johnson, Keith Roberts and Brian Shepherd performing 'Swan Lake' in their lovely tutus, and also some wonderful poems recited by Joan and Howard Maw when our booked entertainment cancelled at the last minute. We had to postpone the whole party in 2010 when the weather conditions were too appalling; the snow was piled up so high in the Village Hall Car Park that it was impossible even for a snow plough to get in! So, we had a Spring Party instead that year, with daffodils instead of holly.

Fundamentally though, this party is all about people. Many of our guests were once committee members or hostesses or drivers, and each year we have new helpers, making this truly an all-age village celebration. We are immensely grateful to the original committee (who we think were Alan Farnaby, Charles Megginson, Frank Haworth, Barbara Metcalfe, Margaret Dobson, Pop Wright, George Pearson, Mrs Coverdale, Craig Douglas and Joy Farnaby) and all those villagers, friends and neighbours past and present who have been involved over the last fifty years – THANK YOU! If you have any fond memories of these events do please bring your reminiscences to the party this year and we will make sure they are archived!

Planning Applications for consideration

16/01835/HOUSE Dorlin House, Cornborough Road, Sheriff Hutton Formation of vehicular access to serve land to rear of Dorlin House. Applicant – Mr. James Shaw Decision – No Objection.

The Parish Council were also sent the following pre planning application:-

Proposed base station installation Land at Carr Hill, Sheriff Hutton

Installation of a new 15.0 slimline phase 4.5 Phosco monopole column with 3 no antennas on the headframe, 2 no 300mm diameter dishes below the antennas at a height of 11.0m and 11.5, 2no equipment cabinets at ground level on a new concrete foundation, the development to be enclosed by a new 1.1m wooden stock proof fence and ancillary development.

Clarke Telecom

Telefonica have assessed a number of options in respect of the site search process and now consider the best solution as Carr Hill. The site is required in order to provide new 4G coverage for Vodaphone and improved 2G/3G services.

Comments to be submitted – The Parish Council have no objection to the proposal but would like to request that, if approved, any mast and equipment installed is to be painted green, in order to help it be in keeping with the area.

Ryedale District Council – Decisions and Appeals

16/01691/FUL 38 Alan Farnaby Way, Sheriff Hutton

Installation of windows at ground floor and mezzanine level to allow the use as offices of part of the existing industrial unit. Approved.

Pecketts Yard

The Parish Council feel that the recently released Construction Traffic Management Plan is totally unacceptable. One of the particular areas of concern was the statement – 'Subject to the agreement of Scarborough Borough Council, no waiting cones shall be provided along East End and at the proposed holding area(s) to assist deliveries and construction traffic accessing the site safely.'

The Parish Council are now raising this with Ryedale District Council (RDC) and have requested a site meeting with RDC, the Parish Council and Daniel Gath Homes.

Closure & Removal of Telephone Boxes in Ryedale

As advised in the last Village News the Parish Council were recently consulted on the removal of the telephone box on Main Street. As the Parish Council received no requests from residents wishing to see the retention of the telephone box we have now advised British Telecom that we have no objection to its removal.

Dog Fouling Poster Competition

In conjunction with the Primary School the Parish Council recently ran a poster competition to try and help highlight the issue of dog fouling within the village. The school children were all asked to produce a suitable poster and the Parish Council were extremely pleased to have received 42 entries in total. The standard received was extremely high and the Chairman and Clerk had a very tough job choosing the winning entries. The Parish Council would like to thank the school for their assistance with the competition and to all the children for entering. The winning entries were:-

1st Prize – Kirsty Noble, 2nd Prize – Daisy Summers, 3rd Prize – Tommy Marwood.

The Parish Council hope the winning children enjoy spending their book tokens. In the New Year the Parish Council will be converting the winning entries into posters for displaying throughout the village.

2017/18 Precept

After discussion it was agreed for the 2017/18 precept to be raised by 2% to £16,126.20. This small increase is due to ever decreasing grants being given to the Parish Council by North Yorkshire County Council for grass cutting and the filling of salt bins.

Bogus tradesmen/Doorstop callers

Following a recent incident in the Whitby area we would urge everyone to be aware that Bogus tradesmen may be operating in the North Yorkshire area.

These people may appear genuine and may even have transport with a company name on . However they may charge exorbitant fees for small works, or claim works need doing that you are unable to check yourself e.g. a broken tile on the roof when in fact there is nothing wrong.

The following is general advice to prevent you becoming a victim of these unscrupulous individuals:

- Never accept to have work carried out by an uninvited caller. This applies to people calling at your home or telephoning you.
- If in doubt about claims your property is damaged delay the person involved and call a local builder, family member or friend for advice or a second opinion.
- Do not give permission for any tradespersons to carry out inspections in or on your house if you have not invited them before they arrived.
- Never pay money for work before it is started.
- Always ask for some identification, write the details down along with any vehicle details.
- Do not, under any circumstances, allow the contractor to take you to a bank or building society to take money out for them. No professional or reputable tradesperson will do this.
- If you are having work carried out and the estimate is over £42.00, the contractor, IN LAW MUST provide you with the estimate in writing with the contractors contact details and exactly what work is to be done.
- It is always a good idea to get a number of quotes prior to having work carried out.
- If you are in doubt about the person, then contact North Yorkshire Trading Standards on 01609 780 780 and they will offer advice.
- If you are visited by anyone wanting to carry out work on your home and you did not invite them and you are in any way suspicious about them, phone the police immediately.
