It was an early start for our visit to Great Wood at Flaxton for the dawn chorus. However, it was a lovely morning and the birds were in full voice. This was a great opportunity to explore the wood and discover its bird life. All the usual suspects were there including blackbirds, robins, chaffs and wrens and somehow, no one seems to have told the wren it is one of the smallest birds around as it is certainly one of the loudest!

Our next trip breaks with our normal routine in that it is a mid-week visit to Helmsley Walled Garden on Wednesday July 4th. This will be an all day visit and anyone who would like to come should meet at The Highwayman Pub car park at 10am. Entrance to the Garden is £7.50 and there are five acres of garden including wild meadow areas and plenty of bird life. There will be a short, guided tour when we arrive and then plenty of time to explore at our leisure. A wide variety of refreshments are available from The Vine House Cafe on site and there is also a Plant Centre should anyone be inspired to plant something new in their garden.

Neighbourhood Watch

In view of the increasing incidence of Computer, Telephone and Doorstep Fraud, North Yorkshire Police are launching a campaign to provide advice on "Preventing Fraud", by a series of talks around the area, the dates of which are to be announced shortly. It is hoped to arrange one in our Village Hall in August, as this is a very important issue, and as a similar talk put on by Thornton-le- Clay Parish Council recently, was poorly attended by the village.

As the weather has improved, the Community Speedwatch team have been able to carry out three one hour surveys, from two locations on Finkle Street, up to the time of going to press. A total of 374 vehicles passed through in the direction of survey, with NO vehicles exceeding the allowed tolerance. It was obvious that vehicles were slowing down having seen our mandatory warning signs, which puts into question the long-term effectiveness of the scheme. We will be carrying out further sessions, and extending the range of operation.

Gardening Tips for July

- Dead-heading roses back to just above a leaf will, with most roses, encourage a second crop of flowers later in the summer/autumn.
- Give tomato plants under glass or polythene a liquid feed, at least once a week, with a potash-based fertiliser. Start this as soon as the first fruits begin to set. Pinch out the leading shoot of the plants once four or five trusses have formed and, except on some bush plants/varieties, remove side shoots on the main stem when they are approximately 5cm long.
- Cut back hardy geraniums by about two thirds following flowering. This will encourage compact and attractive new growth and hopefully a second flush of flowers.
- In mid to late July carry out summer pruning on cordon and espalier forms of apple and pear trees.
- Sow seeds of leeks and spring cabbage in the open and make further sowings of lettuce, radish and other saladings. Cover all brassicas with fine mesh netting to keep out birds and cabbage whites.

22nd May - We were very pleased to welcome back Alison Weir to the History group, this was her second visit with her entourage of around 35 members mainly from USA, New Zealand, Canada and Australia to take refreshments with us and to visit the Castle and Church. For readers interest, Alison is a prolific writer of historical novels which on her first visit helped with her research for the book *Richard III and the Princes in the Tower*. We had a brilliant morning with such interesting people, exchanging information about our group, many of them belonging to history groups in their own countries. Needless to say, the Archive store was a focus of attention.

A BIG thank you to Jill Johnson who had organised the visit, also to Jill Hodges and Roy Thompson who met the visitors with a tour of the Church and Linzi with her Pilates ladies for leaving the car park clear for the coach to park. The refreshments and displays set up by the History group members were excellent ... thank you to all.

25th May - Dr Kate Giles gave us a fascinating illustrated presentation on Shakespeare's Guildhall and the work the Archeologists from University of York were researching in Stratford upon Avon. Kate took us firstly on tour of the medieval Guildhalls around the country, all in a wonderful state of preservation, then onto the Guild of the Holy Cross in Stratford which was established in the 13th century where it became the heart of Stratford's commercial, civic, social and religious life. The Guild provided 'social services' in medieval Stratford supporting families when ill and giving alms to the poor. The Guild Hall included the schoolroom where William Shakespeare was educated. We viewed photographs of a rare 15th century medieval wall painting of John the Baptist uncovered by conservationists; absolutely fascinating. Thank you Kate for a very enjoyable and informative evening; Stratford is definitely worth a visit in the future.
