## **The Gardening Club.**

Our speaker for the March meeting of the club - on Wednesday, March 21<sup>st</sup> - is John Grimshaw talking about Plants, Gardens and People. As he is an expert in many fields and has vast experience of working in gardens, both here and abroad. I feel this will be a most rewarding evening.

### **Tips for March.**

Seed potatoes should be 'chitted' in a shallow tray or egg box with the rose end uppermost. The developing sprouts must receive good light and be kept cool in order to avoid them becoming drawn. Aim to start planting - in containers or the soil in early April.

Rose pruning can start from mid-March onwards, weather permitting. Start with the climbing and rambling varieties, on walls, fences and other supports and then move on to the bush varieties in late March and early April. Prune and trim winter jasmine as it finishes flowering, likewise Forsythia and Ribes sanguineum (flowering currant)

## Playgroup

This half term the children have been busy enjoying a wide range of activities to support their learning – all based upon their individual interests. They have created play areas like 'dinosaur world' and drawn their favourite animal; played Vets and Doctors; they have been exploring musical instruments and experimenting how to change sounds. The older children are practising writing names and initial letter sound games, counting and estimating which lead onto using measuring spoons to carefully transport rice crispies onto plates. They have been re-enacting favourite stories; learning how to work as a team and take turns, avoid conflict, come to mutual agreement and thinking of others feelings.

## Glebe Conservation Area

At the time of writing, there remains a small amount of clearing and burning to do, following the clearance of brambles on the old castle mounds carried out by Andy Chapman. The south boundary hedge thinning was completed earlier this year by Tim Hunt, John Eastlake and Jim Warrington; and re-instatement of the wire fence is also in hand. The sowing of yellow rattle seed in strips at the western halves of the meadows is also complete. The trustees would like to thank all the aforementioned and the other volunteers who helped with the rattle sowing and clearing up. Roll on spring, so the effects of the work can be assessed and appreciated.

It is a continual annoyance and disappointment to record ongoing dog fouling of this village amenity area; dog poo is biologically different to sheep droppings from an ecological point of view, and as the boundary notices state, **it is an offence not to clear up after your dog!**

## Yesterday's Village

### Water In Sheriff Hutton

After what seems to have been a long, wet winter in Sheriff Hutton a different insight on water may be of interest. Two interesting extracts from the Parish Council minutes show the progress in bringing water to the village.

*In July 1932 I sent a letter to Malton Rural District Council as a result of the following resolution. "That Sheriff Hutton Parish Council do not consider the present time opportune for proceeding with a water scheme on which a considerable amount of money would have to be expended, while there is no shortage of water. The Council are quite aware that facilities for obtaining the same are not good they are still of the opinion that if Malton RDC had acted upon the suggestions of the Parish Council the supply would have been adequate for the needs of the parish and they would once again put forward their suggestions as an alternative scheme i.e. that Malton RDC bore for water and fix a pump between Peckitt's Well and the 'Deep Well Pump' in East End."*

A year later no progress had been made, but an extract from October 1935 showed mains water was on its way. A letter was to be sent to Malton RDC that " .... no less than twelve stand pipes were needed."

### And then there was Electricity .....

In 1931 the Parish Council were told that York Corporation could give no information about the bringing of electricity to the village but by January 1933 progress had obviously been made as it is recorded that permission was given for York Electricity Corporation to fix two poles and one stay on the village green. Estimates were obtained for street lighting in October 1938 but it was not until after the war that they were erected.

## THE METHODIST CHURCH

## **Spring in to Lent...**

Spring is definitely here, you just have to look out of the window to see beautiful snowdrops & daffodils in all there resplendent hues of golden yellow. The first lambs are appearing in our countryside and the days are lengthening giving us that knowing expectant feeling that summer is ahead. This may all seem rather deep, even somewhat reflective; you would be right to think so. With Lent having begun on February 14<sup>th</sup> we ought to be in reflective mode.

Just imagine spending time away in a place where there was no mobile phone signal, no internet, Facebook or emails. For some of us it would feel like being cut off from the outside world being incommunicado.

I didn't manage to get away this half term but I still have fond memories of last year and the impact some time away can have. I spent a week in Goathland and what a blessing it turned out to be, to have no interruptions, just peace and quiet and time to *be*, time to reflect, time to take a breather, time to contemplate on life, the universe and everything. Looking out across the fields and the moors to marvel at creation, the beauty and yet the bareness offering a visual paradox, the lush greenness of the valley and stark hostile moors in cold bleak shades of brown.

Jesus came out of the waters of the river Jordan at his baptism, the water teeming with life flowing through the land with the lush vegetation on it banks; from here Jesus goes into the wilderness for forty days in preparation for his ministry. Forty days where he is tested, where he overcomes the temptations placed before him; he overcame adversity with the help of the Holy Spirit. Remember it was the Holy Spirit that drove Jesus into the desert; it was the Holy Spirit that guided him.

It is just the same for us, for you and me, whether we are enjoying the lush valleys of life or we find ourselves experiencing the adversity of the wilderness. We are not alone, Jesus promised 'I will not leave you orphaned;' and he won't.

This month of March takes us into Holy Week, might I make a suggestion, that somehow or some way between now and Holy Week and Easter Day (April 1<sup>st</sup> this year), take some time to look, take some time to just 'be' with God even if you are experiencing elation and joy or pain and sorrow, you are not alone, you are not on your own, and all around you God has placed little reminders (yes, it's sometimes hard to see them) of his abiding presence with us. After all, this season of Lent helps each of us to prepare for Easter and that timely reminder that God spared nothing in giving us his Son to die and rise again so that we can have access to our Father in heaven.

May you be blessed this Lententide, and may the resurrection power of our Lord and Saviour sustain and uplift you.
