Sadly we have frequently come across scrap metal dealers driving around during the weekend of our auction so **PLEASE DO NOT** leave any items unattended outside your home.

The Village Hall will be open as usual for you to bring items on **Friday 6 - 9pm** but we can only accept items on the **Saturday from 9 - 10pm** so we have time to get the hall ready.

The hall will be open for viewing from 11-12 and the Auction will begin at 12 noon.

If you are having a Spring clean (decluttering, experimenting with minimalism or 'sparkling' joy with Marie Kondo) we would be very grateful to receive donations of **good quality household and garden items** (sports equipment, indoor and outdoor furniture, office items, tools, tableware, camping gear, kitchenware etc).

We <u>CANNOT SELL</u> the following items: <u>large 'white' electrical goods, microwave ovens, mattresses, car seats, bike helmets, old TVs (pre-digital) and clothes.</u>

We can **ONLY SELL** upholstered furniture if there are current fire safety labels attached.

Please do not be offended if we cannot accept a large item (even a good sofa) if we already have enough for the auction. We have previously sold pianos 'unseen' by auctioning a removable part and letting the buyer arrange to collect the item from the donor. Moving very heavy items is not always possible and we do have to find a way to dispose of all unsold items and completely clear the hall on the Saturday evening. As a rule of thumb, we may have to refuse any items over 6 feet long or wide.

Light lunches and refreshments are available all day, and we are always very grateful for any donations of cakes and buns. If you are able to help on the day for an hour or more on the Friday night or the Saturday and haven't already been asked please phone Anna 878180.

William Morris - A big thank you to Roy Thompson for a very interesting and illuminating presentation about the life of William Morris who was influential in the Arts and Crafts movement. He became Involved in the Pre-Raphaelite movement designing and painting frescos in the new Oxford University Union. He designed and made wallpaper and furniture with Sir Edward Burnes-Jones his lifelong friend; they designed and furnished the stained glass in Castle Howard Chapel. He was a man of the time, artist, designer, poet, politician, conservationist, his first wallpaper design in 1862 named 'Daisy' can be seen in use today. If you are interested in learning more about William Morris we have a handout about his life put together by Roy available from the History group.

The Gardening Club

Our last talk of this winter is on Wednesday, April 17th at 7.30 in the village hall when Stella Exley will explain her title:-

Camassia, Chris, Chelsea & Chaos

Our suggestions for your garden work in April are...

- Complete the pruning of Roses and other deciduous shrubs, Forsythia, winter jasmine and flowering currant should be pruned when flowering has finished.
- Apply a general fertiliser dressing around the base of roses and other shrubs, incorporate to a
 depth of not more than 25mm with a border fork. Use specific ericaceous feed [either solid or
 liquid] for Azaleas and other acid soil loving plants.
- Herbaceous perennials too will benefit from a general feed, particularly gross feeders such as Hostas and Hellebores.
- There is still time in early April to lift and divide herbaceous perennials such as Heleniums.Phlox and Asters etc. Take young healthy divisions from the outer edges of the clump and discard the old, woody central part. This process can be repeated every 3 years or so to maintain health and vigour. Take the opportunity to incorporate some well-rotted organic matter when
- replanting.

 As the soil warms up later in the month prepare outdoor areas and seedbeds for sowing hardy annual flower and vegetables seeds and potatoes setts.eg, parsnips, peas and lettuce.
- Apply a spring fertiliser or combined 'weed & feed' product which should include a moss killer, to lawns. Do this when the grass is dry. Irrigate afterwards if there is no rain after 24 hours.

Neighbourhood Watch,

Since the last Village News, I have had reports of thefts of lead in Thornton le Clay, copper and a chainsaw within the village, two incidences of Scam phone calls, and two incidences of Cold Calling, so please make sure that your property is secure, and be wary of unfamiliar phone calls and doorstep callers.

Also, since the weather was improving, the Speedwatch team have managed to carry out three one hour sessions, when 487 vehicles passed through the village North to South, with four offenders over 36 mph.
