## The Gardening Club

Our outing planned for July is a visit to Ness Hall. This is on Wednesday, July 17<sup>th</sup>. We plan to meet in the village hall car park at 6.15pm and to be at Ness by 7.00pm. For those of you who are making a first visit, this is a beautiful long, maintained walled garden with an abundance of interesting perennials and shrubs and much else.

### Gardening activities for July.

Hardy deciduous Azaleas can provide a wonderful range of colours and some delightful fragrance in the garden during late April, May and early June followed by rich foliage colour in the autumn. There are numerous cultivars and 3 of the best are 'Klondyke', 'Percil' and 'Irene Koster'.

Sometimes these shrubs get rather 'leggy' and the best time to prune them is soon after flowering. A light to moderate pruning will suffice and will, in time, result in bushier new growth. Use rain water for these acid loving plants and once a month treat them to an application of a proprietary brand of Rhododendron or Azalea liquid feed when the soil is moist.

Dead heading roses to just above the 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> leaf under the faded flowers is certainly beneficial and with most roses results in a 2<sup>nd</sup> and even 3<sup>rd</sup> flush of blooms later in the summer and autumn. Give them encouragement in the form of a generous liquid feed containing a good supply of potassium - proprietary brands of tomato feed are suitable, apply to moist soil once a fortnight.

Cutting back some of the earlier herbaceous perennials will not only tidy up the plants but will usually lead to a second flowering and attractive new foliage in the late summer. Hardy geraniums such as *G. endressii* and cultivars are good examples of where this applies.

In late July the summer pruning of cordon and espalier apple and pear trees can be carried out.

Sow seeds of spring cabbage and leeks in the open, raised bed or cold frame. Further sowings of saladings such as lettuce, radish, spring onion and rocket can be made. Water seed bed before sowing the seeds and protect from birds, cats etc.

#### History Group Notes and Recollections.

The sad death of Don Pomfret noted elsewhere in this issue was received with particular regret by members of the History Group. Don's work as both editor and contributor was vital in creating the book "Impressions of a History", some twenty years on from its publication still an indispensable introduction to the history of the village. Under Don's guidance the book emerged as a treasure store of vivid and thought-provoking observations on the past of the village. Here is a tiny selection from amongst them.

**Earliest Days.** Sheriff Hutton's first recorded appearance is in the Domesday Book of 1086. It lists three names - Turchil, Turoff and Turston as working some 700 acres with oxen and ploughs. Total annual taxable value was ten shillings.

**Church Schools.** The Victorian era produced two faith-related schools (Church of England and Wesleyan.) They had similar arrangements: separate entrances and playground areas for boys and girls; heating by huge coke-burning stoves; and earth lavatories in the yards.

**War 1939 -- 1945.** Most villagers felt reasonably safe but many households built their own dugout shelters they were great places to play, but people did feel somewhat threatened when bombs were dropped in three separate instances in the vicinity of Sheriff.

A fascinating feature of "Impressions" is the way in which one could go on and on for page after page deriving little pictures like those cited above. In retrospect - "*Well done,*" Don and associates and "*Thank You.*"
