UCCC New Year Party - Saturday 4th January 2020

One of the longest standing traditions in our lovely village is the United Christian Churches Committee New Year Party. The UCCC was set up over 50 years ago by representatives of the two village churches to provide a free party in early January for all 'senior citizens' in Sheriff Hutton, Lilling and Stittenham to brighten the start to each New Year. Since then each year about 100 guests receive a warm welcome and a delicious supper followed by festive entertainment. An amazing team of volunteers wait on each table making sure guests stay well-supplied with food, drinks and good cheer

The party begins at 5pm (although most guests arrive at about 4.45pm for a glass of sherry or fruit juice) and is usually finished by around 7.30. This year, by popular request, the **Thornton-le-Dale Ukeleles** will be returning, hopefully with more kazoos! They are currently fundraising for Macmillan Cancer Support and are donating all proceeds to this very worthy cause. It's also an opportunity to meet Rev Steve Whiting and Rev Ruth Duck who will greet you on arrival, say grace and stay for supper. Those who cannot get to the village hall can have their tea delivered to their door or we can arrange lifts to and from the party.

Everyone aged 65+ (and their partner) who lives in the parish of Sheriff Hutton is eligible to attend the party. The longstanding tradition has been for members of the UCCC to walk around the parish delivering invitations personally to ensure that everyone sees at least one friendly face between Christmas and New Year! The Parish Council met on the 13th December 2019. Councillors present at the meeting were Penny Bean (Chairman), Elaine Nelson, Sally Wright, Marcus Oxendale and Martin Dodd. Councillor Eric Hope (part meeting only).

2019 ended on a note of sadness with the resignation of the Chairman, Douglas Wooles, due to ill health.

Douglas has had a very long association with the Parish Council. For many years before he became a Parish Councillor he attended almost every meeting as a member of the public and contributed in many ways. He served on various committees in his unfailing interest in the community and his wish to see Sheriff Hutton prosper and move forward without losing its own identity. To this end he was very involved in the formation of the Village Development Plans.

He is a true gentleman and he has chaired the Parish Council in his quiet, diplomatic and courteous way, even when dealing with the most contentious and emotive issues. With his years of experience he set a high standard in leadership.

Douglas's contribution to the work of the Parish Council has been invaluable and we will miss his calming influence.

Celebrating 50 Years of the Village News

A very BIG thank you to Eric Hayhurst and Richard Haste for an entertaining account of the highs and lows of producing the Village News. Eric spoke first: as joint editor with Alan Farnaby in 1969 they produced the first copy of a folded foolscap, 3 page edition to be distributed on the first day of the month, which after 50 years still drops though our letter boxes on the agreed date, what a great service. Eric spoke 'fondly' of the voluntary hours he and Alan spent turning the Roneo 1800 times, fingers covered in ink to print 300 copies which kept villagers in touch with community activities and services.

In 2003 sadly Alan died and a new team of editors Wendy & Richard Haste, Lynne & Brian Shepherd produced the news and with the help of computers the work became easier, though it is still a time-consuming task. Peter Hepburn joined the team in 2018 and the 5 of them work together in rotation editing your news. Richard gave us an amusing journey down memory lane of events and people, highlighting that Beaumont's garage advertised in the 1st News and is still advertising today, a Guinness book of records entry for a small rural village? Now 660 copies are distributed by a dedicated group of volunteers to Sheriff, Lilling, Farlington, Whenby. Grateful thanks to Eric and Richard on the research and hard work that had been achieved to give us this nostalgic presentation.

Penny Bean, acting chairman of the Parish Council closed the meeting with a thank you to everyone involved in the production of the Village News noting that in celebration of the 50 years a copy of the 1st edition and photograph of Eric and Alan will be displayed in the Village Hall in recognition of their commitment to community news.

As we close our meetings for 2019 we would like to thank Tim, Andy, Terry Johnson (village hall) Claire & Barrie (post office) for the invaluable support they have given us throughout the year. Glebe Conservation Area

Visitors to the Glebe will have noticed major work on the south perimeter in the last few weeks. With the benefit of a section 106 grant from Ryedale District Council, we employed a contractor to reduce the hawthorn trees that were shading the adjacent meadow and providing only limited shelter or nesting potential for birds. After clearing the hedge of brambles etc., we have planted slips of hawthorn, field maple, spindle, dogwood, crab apple, dog rose and guelder, which will in time be denser, more diverse and attractive to birds in particular. (Hopefully after spring, there will be more to see than stumps, protective tubes and canes!) We also re-instated the fence which had been taken down to provide access for the contractor. Thanks for all the above work goes to Angela and Stuart Dick, John Eastlake, Tim Hunt, Neil Marwood, Jim Warrington and Peter Wheeler.

The sheep have done a good job in getting the grass down, and will be leaving at the end of December. After that there is burning and more tidying up to do when the weather allows.
