St Helen and the Holy Cross - YOUR PARISH CHURCH

As Treasurer I want to share some of the work we have been carrying on with whilst the Church Building has been closed under Government instructions due to the pandemic. Inevitably, the last few months have incurred costs for the building and churchyard not covered by income which would normally come from collections at services and fees for weddings and funerals. This has left an unplanned deficit in our accounts which I estimate will be about £2,500 at the end of the year. I had planned a break-even budget.

Although we have been unable to hold services in the building; members of the congregation have supported the wider village community playing a leading role in the Village Volunteers alongside the Parish Council, including liaising with North Yorkshire County Council, Ryedale District council and the other partners across the county delivery voluntary services to the socially isolated.

During the Easter Season, the Parish Church has organised the village response to the needs of the Ryedale Food Bank sending several boxes of food each week, a service which will continue.

As so many villagers were working from home or school, the footpaths through the churchyard were ever more widely used and it was agreed by the PCC that maintenance should be continued during the shutdown including amenity mowing and footpath access for the use and well-being of the wider community.

Our Vicar, whose stipend is our major cost, has been very busy helping out other parishes within the wider Deanery where clergy have been unable to work due to their medical conditions with funerals and pastoral work carried out in testing conditions. The costs are carried partly by our parish members.

Sheriff Hutton Bridge Cricket Club

Collective Oil Buying – Village Group Now Welcoming New Members from Farlington, Whenby and Stittenham

Many years after the group being set up buying heating oil collectively as a way of saving some money, we are now in a position that we can welcome new people to the group. In addition to any new people from Sheriff Hutton and Lilling we now include anyone interested from Farlington, Whenby and Stittenham.

The group is run by volunteers purely for the convenience and to provide savings to Villagers. On the last 2 orders despite very different oil prices each person saved 10% or more on the standard order price including VAT. We tend to have orders around 4 times a year – the next is expected to be August for September. The supplier for many years has been BATA at Amotherby who are well known to many people in the village and have been very reliable and friendly over the years. All deliveries should occur on the same date given by BATA as this leads to a reduction in cost.

The deadline date for orders will be published in Village News; orders will be placed by email. As soon as we have a total number of litres required we can discuss the price with BATA and then let each person know how much their order will cost and the planned delivery date. The minimum quantity which can be ordered is 500 litres but you can order any number of litres above that. Payment can be made to the driver or by phone to BATA within 7 days of the delivery.

We will then include you in the email reminder for the next order which will be sent to all members as well as notification in Village News. If you would like an order at that point you can let us know, if not we will just contact you again the next time.

Please note to enable this to work your details will be held on a database, and certain details e.g. name and order shared with the rest of the group and name, address and contact details will be provided to BATA or a future oil provider in connection with oil orders. Village Show 2020 Update

We are still hoping to have a village show on Saturday 8th August, especially as you may have been using the time in lockdown to tend your garden and be creative, with arts, crafts cooking and/or photography. However, it does depend on the government allowing community centres such as the village hall to re-open. We are dependent on what government rules are in force at the time, and we might need either to delay until September or cancel altogether.

But we are hoping for the best and making plans to run the show in August. We will need to take great care that we manage things safely, with appropriate social distancing and other health and safety measures. Some arrangements will need to be a bit different - for example we will ask for entries in advance by Saturday 1st August. If some people are still shielding at home, we are happy to make arrangements to ensure that they can still enter items, and find a way for them to see the results. Arrangements for using the hall will be different too, especially as it is unlikely that we will be able to have so many exhibits and people there at one time as usual. For this reason, we have reduced the number of classes, and entries to a maximum of one per class.

We may not be able to offer refreshments or hold a prize giving. If we can't present prizes on the day, prizes and trophies will be delivered to local addresses and as usual prize winners will be listed in the September (or October) Village News.

But for now, please have a look at the show schedule, start planning your entries and keep your fingers crossed that we can have the show in August or, failing that, in September.

The Gardening Club

Pause for a moment to reflect on the wonderful displays of colourful flowers and foliage to be seen around our village this spring. Daffodils, Cherry blossom, Lilacs, Clematis, Tulips, Roses, Peonies, Bluebells, Hawthorn blossom and more, all of these giving us joy and hope for the future.

Gardening Tips for July

- Trim privet hedges at least once this month to keep them looking tight, attractive and effective
 as a hedge. The golden leaved and variegated cultivars look particularly good and give
 cheerful colour all the year round.
- From time to time it is necessary to give all hedges, particularly those alongside public footpaths, a more severe cutting back. Hedges, beech and Leyland Cypress in particular can gradually become wider than they are tall and occupy at least half the width of the footpath. The severely pruned hedge will usually soon fill in with new growth & foliage whilst pedestrians will appreciate their restored right of way.
- The dry and sunny May led to some superb early roses, you can keep them "on track" for repeat flowering throughout the summer and early autumn by pruning the old flower heads just above the first or second good leaf underneath the faded flower. Work a little rose fertiliser lightly into the soil around the rose bushes and water in well or apply some liquid feed high potash tomato feed is ideal, to moist soil every 3 weeks. Remove any briar suckers coming from the rootstock by pulling or prising them from the point of origin rather than pruning them off at soil level.
- Summer pruning of intensively trained, usually cordon or espalier, apples and pear trees should be carried out later this month. Cut back the old flowering stems and tatty foliage on early flowering herbaceous perennials such as Pulmonarias, Geums, Alchemilla mollis and early flowering geraniums (cransbills). All will respond by producing fresh new foliage and some will flower again in the early autumn.
- Consider installing some rain water butts in your garden, particularly if you grow fruit and vegetables. Soggy gardens in March became parched earth 6 weeks later and 50 gallons of water didn't go far during the near rainless month of May. A lot of rain water comes off the roof of a shed, glasshouse or conservatory let alone of a house or bungalow. It seems a pity to let it go to waste.
- Tomato plants grown under glass should now be potted on into their final pot, 30cm.is ideal or planted direct into the greenhouse soil. Growbags seem to have declined in popularity, probably because it is tricky to control and distribute the amount of water and feed in them. Growbag compost can, of course be put into pots. Outdoor cultivars such as 'Crimson Crush' (Blight proof it is claimed) can be planted in a warm, sheltered spot if you have not already done so. Train your tomato plants regularly. Cultivars such as Shirley - ever reliable, Gardeners Delight and Sungold, both cherry sized. These are the cordon (single stem) type so remove the side shoots when about 5cm long (these can easily be rooted to provide plants for a second crop, space permitting!!) Provide as much ventilation as possible for the plants growing in glasshouses and conservatories, it can become very hot and arid otherwise and scorching occur. Some form of shading may and wilting may be Water plants thoroughly when they need it and allow them time to use up that water before watering again. This is far better than watering frequently in 'dribs and drabs'. Provide some extra atmospheric moisture and by placing 2 or 3 large plant saucers of water in amongst your tomatoes and other plants.
- Nip the tips out of Broad Bean plants to avoid them becoming infested with blackfly (or black bean aphid). Check your beans regularly for this pest, timely action can resolve a potential problem whilst avoiding the need to spray insecticides. Harvest broad beans whilst they are young and tender, likewise garden peas.
- Take semi-ripe cuttings or 'slips' of pinks, lavender, rosemary and many other shrubs, alpines & perennials. These are usually side shoots that have started to ripen(harden) near the shoot base. Root them in gritty compost in a pot or cold frame. Be patient!!

Village Volunteers

The Village Volunteers have been busy again although things have been just a little quieter. Up to the two weeks before 8th June there were 43 shops with 32 people helped, 38 phone calls with 27 people helped and 10 medication collections with 9 people helped. Additional activities this fortnight included making face masks, dog-walking, grass cutting, car wash, collecting plants from garden centre, making cakes, curries, gardening, and the pop-up library in Coble Lane which continues to be successful.

So, a huge thank you to all the Village Volunteers – there is still activity happening and plenty of keep-in-touch phone calls being made. Also, there are other ways of helping that might have happened anyway but perhaps villagers felt they could ask. It still feels a real community effort and the Volunteers really built upon the existing community spirit in Sheriff, Lilling, Stittenham and Cornborough. I think that when we have worked through Covid-19 to the extent where it is being managed, the legacy of the Volunteers will be stronger relationships, new friends and links with people that we didn't know before.

And please still do get in touch with your local team if you would like any shopping done, medication collected or would just appreciate a chat on the phone. There may be other things we can help with, or if we can't we can usually find someone who can!
