The Parish Council met on 12 December 2014 Councillors present at the latter were Douglas Wooles (Chairman), Penny Bean (Vice-Chairman), Brian Parkinson, Martin Dodd, Sally Downing, Dave Smith and David Lea. The Clerk was Nigel Knapton and District Councillor Eric Hope was present.

Planning Applications for consideration

14/01219/CAT – To fell 1 x Ash Tree at Stile House, The Green, Sheriff Hutton for Mr Andrew Caley. **No objections.**

Ryedale District Council – Decisions and Appeals

None received.

Public Forum

Several members of the public spoke about their concerns regarding proposed fracking in the district. They had formed a group called the 'Fracking Information Group'. The Council agreed to contact Third Energy, the company making a planning application to carry out activity at Kirby Misperton, to ask them to meet in order to hear their proposals.

Affordable Housing

Colin Huby, the Ryedale DC Rural Housing Enabler spoke about the current situation regarding the proposal for affordable housing on land off Mill Lane. Yorkshire Housing had withdrawn from the proposal but fortunately York Housing Association were interested and were just completing costings on the project. Colin circulated an indicative plan showing proposed housing mix of either 12 or 8 properties, an immediate need of 8 properties having been identified from the housing needs survey with a longer term need for 12. Properties would only be let to local people and would be affordable in perpetuity as part of any planning agreement. Nothing would go ahead without the agreement of the Parish Council and public consultation on any proposed plans. The item would be put on the next agenda.

Christmas Tree

New Christmas Tree lights had been purchased as the old ones had failed. Unfortunately the area below the Christmas Tree is being used as a dog toilet and lots of dog waste had to be removed before the new lights could be fitted. Owners are reminded to put dog waste in the bins provided or take it home.

Neighbourhood Watch

For the time of year this has been a remarkably quiet month, with little of note in this or any of the surrounding villages.

I can't help but noticing whilst walking my dogs of an evening the number of 'elderly' people out and about on foot, often on their own, apparently heading to or from some club/society/church meeting. Whilst it's obviously rather nice that such individuals feel safe walking around in the dark I cannot help but be concerned at the potential implications of a fall/accident of some sort. Can I respectfully ask that anyone organising events for winter evenings makes suitable transport arrangements for the most vulnerable people attending, or maybe considers scheduling the meeting for a more suitable time of day – I'm fairly sure even God would understand the need for compromise during the long, dark winter nights. Just a thought.

For those of you who either own a farm or who work on one, the Police ask that all nitrate fertiliser stores are kept secure until used, and that any thefts of such material, or suspicious incidents involving nitrates are reported immediately to them. Whilst on the surface this may seem an odd request, be aware that fertilisers have uses beyond making crops grow quickly. And no, I will not elaborate on the subject.

No further news on the missing dogs, other than perhaps to note that the national press appears to finally be waking up to the issue. All dog owners please remain vigilant and be mindful of the ongoing threat.

Please be mindful that this time of year is one of the peak burglary periods, so take care to secure your property at all times and ring 101 if you see anything untoward (including perhaps overweight bearded types trying to gain access down chimneys in the latter part of December, especially if they have a white van rather than a sleigh).

To bring you up to date our last Jumble Sale of 2014 was yet again a record breaker. Despite the short time that York Against Cancer Supporters had to collect jumble they pulled out all the stops and arrived at the Village Hall with a Mini bus and 2 cars bulging with goodies. Long before the sale started queues of eager buyers waited in the rain, ready for the doors to open. As usual the book room was very popular and was doing a roaring trade when it opened at 1pm. We just managed to sort all the jumble in time to open at 2pm and the main hall was soon full to capacity.

Many, many thanks to everyone who supported by sending jumble and giving very generous cash donations. The total raised was a fantastic £2,400 which will go towards the cost of a new mini bus to be used to transport patients to Leeds for treatment.

The Second Hand Jewellery stall held at the School Christmas Fair raised £123 which gives a total raised at our events throughout the year to £18,774 a new record.

Our first sale of 2015 will be for the Guide Dogs for the Blind on Saturday 24th January at 2pm (book room open at 1pm). Donations of jumble, books, cakes and prizes will be very much appreciated and can be brought to the Hall between 9.30 and 12 noon on the day.

Way back in 1986 Doreen Lynch and I together with the late May Barner and Doreen Langdale started fund raising jumble sales to raise money for the then new music room (now the office/staff room) at the School. At that time we were very happy to raise £200. Who would have thought that 30 years later we would still be running them and achieving such fantastic totals. Over the years many lovely people have been members of the Jumblies Team and we have many happy memories.

We have worked with some fantastic support groups and many of our village groups and organisations have benefitted from the money raised at our fund raising events.

We can remember reaching our first £500 which was for the Guide Dogs for the Blind and the first £1,000 was to raise money for the Play Area. I don't think any of us could envisage reaching £2,000 which remained out of reach for so long but 2014 saw us doing this 4 times. I think to reach £3,000 we are going to have to request an extra wing be built on the village Hall to accommodate all the jumble needed.

Thank you so much to everyone for your continued support. Thank you to the Village Hall Trustees and Management Committee for providing the venue and particularly to the long suffering caretakers and booking secretaries over the years. Thank you to those people who step in to help us when we need you. We hope we can count on you for our future events.
