The Parish Council met on the 12th June 2015. Councillors present at the meeting were Douglas Wooles (Chairman), Penny Bean (Vice-Chairman), Brian Parkinson, Sally Downing and Martin Dodd. The Clerk was Louise Pink and no members of the public were present.

Planning Applications for consideration

15/00527/FUL – Change of use and alteration of section of barn to form additional accommodation for the existing holiday cottage to include raising the roof height and installation of windows and entrance door at The Granary, Cheese Vat Farm, Daskett Hill, Sheriff Hutton for Mr John Gordon-Finlayson. **No objections.**

15/00621/HOUSE – Erection of part two storey/part single storey side extension to east elevation at South View, West End, Sheriff Hutton for Mr & Mrs J & M Reed. **No objections.**

15/00377/MFUL – Installation and operation of a solar farm and associated infrastructure including photovoltaic panels, mounting frames, inverters, transformers, substations, communication building, fence and pole mounted CCTV cameras and temporary construction vehicular access at the Land at Mill Hill Farm, Cornborough, Sheriff Hutton for Lightsource Renewable Energy Ltd. Revised plans received including amended layout, revised Heritage appraisal, additional Ecological information, revised landscaping plan and revised access plan. After lengthy discussion and consideration the Parish Council agreed that the revised documents have met all of the Parish Council's initial concerns. The Parish Council, therefore, has decided to withdraw its original objection.

Ryedale District Council – Decisions and Appeals

On the 12th May 2015 Ryedale District Council confirmed Tree Preservation Order No. 338/2014 without modification.

Temporary Road Closures – 25th & 26th July 2015

The Castle Howard Triathlons will take place on Saturday 25th and Sunday 26th July. Due to the race passing through Sheriff Hutton there will be temporary road closures briefly whilst competitors pass through the village. The reason for the closures is for the protection of the competitors, spectators and the travelling public. Pedestrian access to affected premises will be maintained at all times with vehicular access maintained whenever possible.

Reminder to Dog Owners

The Parish Council has had a number of complaints from householders and farmers about people bagging up their dog's waste and throwing the bags into gardens and fields. As well as this being extremely anti-social it is very dangerous where livestock are grazing. Over the past years the Parish Council has provided dog waste bins, which are located around the village and are regularly emptied by Ryedale District Council. These bins are well used by the majority of dog walkers, however, there are a few very irresponsible dog owners who having bagged the waste choose to dispose of it by this unacceptable method. Anyone who sees this happening and can identify the dog owner involved can report them anonymously to the Dog Warden at Ryedale District Council. Please remember to keep your dog on a lead and under control when walking in fields where livestock are grazing

Coach Road Footpath

The Government Inspector has now published his decision, which is that there should be a public footpath from The Lodge at the west end of the Coach Road as far as the lake in front of the Hall. The section from the lake to Lodge Farm should NOT be a public footpath. The section from Lodge Farm to the east end of the Coach Road at Moor Lane is already a public bridleway.

This modification will come into effect within a few weeks unless there are objections by either side.

There is a right to challenge the Inspector's decision within a short time frame. Would anyone who gave evidence or filled in an "Evidence of Use Form" who would like further information or to comment on this matter please contact Dick or Jill Johnson ASAP or at any rate **before July 14**th.
