All Change!

In the days of the steam train, the guard would come through the carriages shouting, "All change." It was a reminder that we all had to get out at the next station to find our connections for the next part of our journey. Change in life is inevitable. We cannot live without it. Yet people resist.

My grandmother was born in 1878. She saw electricity brought into the home, the advent of the

telephone, motor car, aeroplane, radio, TV, National Health Service and survived two World Wars. Her interests and opinions were very parochial. She couldn't stand Aneurin Bevin, but we never knew why. She chose to use an oven heated by a coal fire, did the washing in a copper, used a mangle, heated her iron on the hob and brushed her carpets. Not for her the electric oven, washing machine and vacuum cleaner.

Technology has revolutionised our lives. The world seems a much smaller place. New ideas, new insights into old ones, shape our thinking and understanding, or at least they should do. But do we still cling to what was, or do we engage in the here and now?

Jesus had a lot to say about change. In fact he came to bring about change; a change of attitude, thinking and direction in life. Over the centuries the Ten Commandments, given to the Jewish nation by God to provide a framework for living, had been increased by their leaders to 617 rules for living. By the time Jesus came onto the scene, these rules seemed to exclude many people from God and mainstream society: the poor, the widow, the diseased, those with disabilities, the migrant and immigrant, and people with certain jobs. This was not what God intended. The nation and its leaders had not embraced and developed God's framework so that they grew in understanding and love towards Him and one another. Jesus challenged the leaders of his day and was crucified because of it.

We too need to be challenged in our own lives; how we live and engage with our world. Change is necessary. We all know what happened to the Dodo because it didn't.

Neighbourhood Watch

The next Neighbourhood Watch Meeting will be on Monday 3rd October at 7.30 pm in Sheriff Hutton Village Hall, when the Police will be present to give the Local Crime Report, hear your concerns and answer questions.

Unfortunately the scheduled talk on "WRAP", an initiative to increase awareness of undercover terrorist activity in remote rural areas, has had to be postponed. No further information at time of going to press, but posters will be issued nearer the meeting.

We have had a further instance of Cold Calling, namely Fish Sellers, often acting aggressively towards elderly residents. A local resident promptly and correctly called 101, the Police attended and despatched them. Trading Standards advise that fish should be marked stating what is contained within the packaging, a use by date and other information such as company name and address, also paperwork should be provided to you as a customer.

North Yorkshire Community Messaging advice to residents is not to let anyone into the house, where possible ascertain who callers are before opening the door, and if cold callers are aggressive, then please call the Police on 999, giving as much information as possible.

Christmas Shoeboxes Gift Examples

Firstly some things to avoid please: war/conflict items, religious items or literature, food items other than sweets, (but no chocolate), hand-made toys with stuffing, breakable glass items, liquids, aerosols, sharp objects, medicines, books with lots of words, unwrapped scented items and clothes other than stated below.

Now some ideas: Clothes: hat, fashion and ordinary scarf, gloves, mittens, cap, head bands, ribbons, hair clips, bracelet, necklace, small handbag, sunglasses Ce and UV marked, draw string bag, dressing up items, (e.g. animal ears, crowns).

For fun: skipping rope, building blocks, yo-yo, slinky, dominoes, kaleidoscope, spinning top, jigsaw, toy binoculars, puzzle cube, wind up torch, toy train/car/truck, animal figures, musical instruments: e.g. kazoo, bells, harmonica, mini maracas, recorder, castanets, whistle.

To love: cuddly toy (with CE mark), rag doll (with CE mark), Barbie doll, wooden/plastic play people, hand and finger puppets, wind-up toy, small ball (tennis, rugby, bouncy) deflated football with pump, finger skateboard. **Creative stuff:** chalk, crayons, colouring book, drawing pad, stickers, magnetic drawing board, mini Etch-a-Sketch, mini stampers (pre-inked), click together model, Play Doh, glider kit (non-military), bead kit (age appropriate), small sealed sewing kit (10-14), mini scraper foil kit (10-14), watercolour paint set (solid), stencils, mini Spirograph;

For Cleanliness: toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, flannel, washmitt, sponge, hairbrush, comb, push up deodorant stick (not liquid or aerosol), chapstick, emery board, nail clippers, compact mirror,

For Learning: writing pens and pencils, sharpener, eraser, solar calculator, geometry set (10-14), ruler, exercise book, notebook, highlighters, colouring pencils, felt tip pens, pencil case, safety scissors, glue stick, picture books (2-4), dry-wipe whiteboard and pens, mini board games water bottle

Home-made items: hand-made toys, knitted sewn or crocheted bags, pencil cases, hand puppets, felt play board wooden toys, home-made card or letter with photo
