The meeting was well attended, and the very informative talk was well received, an excellent contribution to the Neighbourhood Watch initiative. Advice given was that in the event of an unwanted phone call, simply hang up immediately, as any response can initiate a payment authorisation scam.

On Monday 13th March, Parish Council leaders and myself met with two members of Yorkshire Housing, to discuss their Customer Support campaign, which will be starting shortly in the village.

I am delighted to report that "Community Speedwatch" is now being rolled out in North Yorkshire, following a very successful trial in Pannal, near Harrogate. Local volunteers can be trained to operate "Speed Guns", and persons observed to be breaking the speed limit will be reported to the Police.
