Please note that this year **Viewing is from 11-12** and **the Auction will begin at 12 noon**.

If you're having a Spring Clean (decluttering, experimenting with minimalism or 'sparking joy' with Marie Kondo) we would be very grateful to receive donations of **good quality household and garden items** (sports equipment, indoor and outdoor furniture, office items, tools, tableware, camping gear, kitchenware etc.)

Please note we can **ONLY** sell upholstered furniture if there are current fire safety labels attached. Please don't be offended if we can't accept a large item (even a good sofa) if we already have enough for the sale. We have previously sold pianos 'unseen' by auctioning a removable part and letting the buyer arrange to collect the item from the donor. Moving very heavy items is not always possible and we do have to find a way to dispose of all unsold items and completely clear the hall on the Saturday evening. As a rule of thumb we may have to refuse any items over 6 feet long or wide.

At this time of year farmers are not likely to be working in the fields after dark, so please be vigilant, particularly if you are out late, and report any unusual activity or suspicious vehicles to 101 immediately, noting vehicle registration numbers, but under no circumstances approach them. If you are of the opinion that a crime is being committed, then call 999 for a faster response.

Reports from locals are vital, and recently enabled a group of "Badger Baiters" to be arrested in the Hovingham area. Our local "Rural Patrol" scheme lapsed some years ago, but anyone prepared to volunteer for such a team, to provide valuable support to the Police, please get in touch.

The Gardening Club

Our February meeting will be on the 20th of the month as usual at 7.30 in the village hall and our speaker will be Sue Wood who will tell us the history of the Valley Gardens in Harrogate.

Gardening Tips for February

If the weather and soil conditions allow there are quite a few jobs to be done.

Hellebores (the oriental type) should have their old leaves removed so that the buds and new leaves are revealed and disease is not spread.

Onion sets, garlic and shallots, if not planted in the autumn, can be planted towards the end of the month or in early March. Work off foot boards to prevent compaction of the soil.

Buy potato sets and chit them. Place the sets rose-end uppermost in trays or egg boxes and keep in well lit, frost free place until planting time.

Plant deciduous shrubs roses, fruit bushes, canes and trees if and when conditions allow.

Place a large pot, tub or bucket over a crown of rhubarb in order to produce some early, tender stems around Easter.

Cut back all old flowering shoots on winter jasmine to within 2 or 3 buds of the base of last year's growth. This will encourage new growth which will flower next winter.

Hard prune straggly deciduous hedges, for example hawthorn and privet to encourage new basal growth.

I hope there are enough dry, warmer days for you to do all this!!!!
