## **Sheriff Hutton History Group**

**Guy Fawkes, the Gunpowder Plot and the Yorkshire Connection:** A big thank to local author Tony Morgan for an excellent presentation on the life of one of York's most infamous sons - Guy Fawkes.

Tony started with Guy's birth 1570 in York to his execution in 1606 on the gallows in London for high treason. He was educated in York at St Peter's School, he was a devout Catholic throughout his life, and as Guido Fawkes he fought for Catholic Spain against the Dutch. His meeting with those who wanted to assassinate King James the first and restore a Catholic King to the throne brought him back to England. In 1604 the conspirators met in London to plan the failed Gunpowder plot. We enjoyed a very interesting evening and raised funds for St Leonard's Hospice which Tony supports with donations from his talks going to charitable causes.

## The Gardening Club.

Our November Meeting is our AGM and is restricted to members only. The official business is short and is followed by a delicious supper brought by members with drinks supplied by the club and some light entertainment. This year we have our member Richard Haste broadening our horizons by taking us on a tour of railway station gardens around the world. We look forward to seeing you all for this feast on **Wednesday November 21<sup>st</sup> at 7.30pm.**

### Tips for November.

Sweep and rake up leaves from deciduous trees and hedges and compost them. Beech, hornbeam and oak leaves make the best leaf mould but mixed leaves are also suitable. Avoid using conifer {other than larch} and evergreen leaves.

Dahlia tubers should be lifted carefully once the top growth has been blackened by frost. Clean off the dead foliage etc. and cut the main stems back to approx. 10cm{4 inches}. Do not wash the tubers but remove as much soil as possible before placing the tubers upside-down in boxes or trays so that moisture can drain out of the hollow stems. Once the tubers are dry they should be dusted with a fungicide such as Flowers of sulphur before covering them with old, dry composts or peat. This will help to prevent the tubers shrivelling. Over-winter them in a dry, frost and rodent proof place, spare room or garage. Good light will not be needed until next March.

Reel up the garden hosepipe and keep it in a frost free and secure place. Turn off indoors, any connecting water supply to outdoor taps or insulate well.

Cleaning and maintenance of garden seats, lawn mowers, shears, loppers and secateurs can be done under cover on wet days, of which we had plenty in October.

Weather and soil conditions permitting, dig over any vacant areas in the veg plot or flower beds and incorporate some organic matter as you do this.

Prune back by about 1/3 bush and standard roses in the large flowered {HT} cluster flowered {F1} and new English groups and also climbing roses. This will tidy up the plants and help prevent wind-rock. Bin the pruning along with any dead wood and rose leaves from the ground which may carry rose rust and black spot spores.

The United Christian Churches Committee was set up over 50 years ago by representatives of the two village churches who wished to provide a free party in early January for all 'senior citizens' in Sheriff Hutton, Lilling and Stittenham. We typically cater for about 100 guests and offer a warm welcome and a seated supper (waited on by a lovely team of volunteers) followed by festive entertainment. Our party begins at 5pm (although most guests arrive at about 4.45 for a glass of sherry or fruit juice) and is usually finished by around 7.30. They are currently fundraising for Macmillan Cancer Support and are donating all proceeds to this very worthy cause.
