The Gardening Club

Tips for the month

Apple and Pear trees should be pruned as required whilst they are fully dormant, during the first 2 months of the year. Try to choose a dry, frost free day for doing this job.

Remove any dead, damaged or diseased wood and with bush, standard and half standard trees try to keep the centre of the tree reasonably open. Aim to let in plenty of light to provide good air movement thereby reducing potential disease problems.

Any mummified fruit (brown rot disease) still hanging on fruit trees plus any remaining on the ground should be removed and binned.

Following any windy weather check trees, roses and other shrubs planted during the past few months. Gently firm in the plants and/or provide supports and ties if they have suffered from wind rock.

Take care when watering indoor pot plants not to overdo things during the next couple of months when daylight quality is often poor and daylight is short. In these conditions growth is slow and too much water will result in yellowing of the leaves or worse. Some plants such as Cyclamen are best watered from the saucer in which the plant is standing.

On sunny, milder days plants in the glasshouse, conservatory, cold frame or poly-tunnel will benefit from some ventilation. Stagnant air and humidity tend to favour the growth of fungal and mould diseases, e.g. botrytis.

Hellebores- usually the species H.niger (the Christmas Rose) and H.hybridus (the Lenten Rose) in their many different cultivars, colours and forms, are now making a colourful display in many gardens. By cutting back to soil level, at least some of the leathery old leaves during January and February, the lovely flowers can be seen much better. It will also help in controlling the dark brown or black fungal leaf spot disease which can decimate these plants. The leaves are prickly and the sap can be a skin irritant, so do wear protective gloves.

Sheriff Hutton Village Market

This time last year our committee of volunteers were working hard in preparation for our first village market which was held in March 2019. We were all nervous, how successful would our market be? Would the villagers enjoy and support the event each month? Could we recruit enough stallholders and would they do well enough to want to return? Would we have enough volunteers to manage the event? Most importantly, could the market raise funds for our community?

Our first market day arrived and people flocked to check out what it was all about. St Helen's Church provided an amazing café which was overflowing with customers, the hall was a hive of activity as people excitedly checked out the array of different stalls whilst outside the weather stayed kind, the traditional market stalls looked excellent and the atmosphere was buzzing - just what we had hoped for but nothing like we had expected. For some of us it was quite emotional to realise that, after 9 months of hard work, our energetic team had pulled together a community spirited, carbon footprint friendly and vibrant market, perfect!

As the months went on, the demand for stallholders grew and we now have a waiting list as, for the last 4 markets, we have been full to capacity with stalls. Remembering that our ethos is to support local businesses, we have such a fantastic array of stalls providing excellent bread, baking, seasonal veg, plants, eco-friendly household products, sweets, drinks (juice and alcohol), meat, art, craft, jewellery, home interiors, preserves, beauty products and much more. Prices are competitive and, knowing that the produce has often been reared, grown or made right on your doorstep means that shopping at our market confirms you are doing your bit

We are now in the process of auditing our finances and agreeing procedures for the distribution of raised funds. Stallholders pay for their pitch each month and these funds have accumulated and, after running costs have been deducted, will be available to various local groups in the near future. First of all we need to confirm the exact funds raised, what is then needed to continue the market after which the remainder will become available to local groups so watch this space for further details. What we can tell you is that the various local organisations who have hosted a café at the market in 2019 raised a total of £5109.69 between them which they retained - well done everyone!

Collective Oil Buying

Many years ago, a small number of people started buying their heating oil as a group as a way of saving some money. Over time the group has grown and now numbers over 60 houses, in Sheriff Hutton and Lilling. Oil prices and price margins fluctuate wildly but savings are in the range of 2p-5p per litre. However, it has become difficult to manage the scheme on the original manual 'system.' Two people have volunteered to join in with operating the scheme and it is going to become a little more structured to make it more manageable. But that means anyone can join in if they need oil at the time of an order. Knowing that everyone wants to be sure of having plenty of warmth at Christmas the annual cycle starts with that in mind. There would be an order in November for delivery during December, February for March, May for June and August for September. The supplier for many years has been BATA at Amotherby who are well known to many people in the village and have been very reliable and friendly over the years. All deliveries should occur on the same date given by BATA as this leads to a reduction in cost.

The deadline date for orders will be published in Village News; orders will be placed by email. As soon as we have a total number of litres required we can discuss the price with BATA and then let each person know how much their order will cost and the planned delivery date. The minimum quantity which can be ordered is 500 litres but you can order any number of litres above that. Payment can be made to the driver or by phone to BATA within 7 days of the delivery.

Which brings us to two questions:

- if there is sufficient take-up for the revised buying scheme, do you want to order oil this month for delivery in March or be included on our email distribution list for future orders? If you do, please email your requirements to **sheriffhuttonoil@gmail.com** by Saturday, February 8th

If new to the group please include your name, email, back up phone number, address, location of oil tank and oil order or request to be added to database.

If the scheme does go ahead, an email reminder for an order will be sent to all members as well as notification on Village News.

Please note to enable this to work your details will be held on a database, and certain details e.g. name and order shared with the rest of the group and name, address and contact details will be provided to BATA or a future oil provider in connection with oil orders. Privacy statement available on request.
