#### Notes:

- If you have a pet, do you have a leash? Don't forget water, food and a blanket.
- Find a radio and or television that provide you information that you understand!
- In addition to registering your shelter, let friends and relatives know where your shelter is located.
- Make sure you pass information to friends and relatives about severe weather approaching their area.

### "Do not" List

- **<u>Do not</u>** use candles, if there is a gas leak this could cause and explosion.
- Do not wait until the last minute to leave your mobile home to seek shelter.
- **<u>Do not</u>** expect immediate rescue after a severe weather event and you are trapped in your storm shelter. Rescue crews may be hampered reaching you due to power lines and other debris blocking the road.
- Do not be in a hurry getting out of your shelter (don't run)! The majority of injuries occur when exiting a shelter, as shelter steps may be slippery with water or mud! Glass, nails and sharp pieces of wood and metal are everywhere. Sifting through belongings during recovery is also hazardous.
- Do not use a lighter, matches or any other object, which can spark and ignite gasoline or other gases. The ignition may cause an explosion which will cause serious injury or death to you and others nearby
