## **Amenities**

As most can see, our skating rink is almost ready! The end screen should be installed by the first week in December. Delays in laying the concrete pad pushed back the construction of the boards and hence the fitting of the end fencing. We will need to wait until spring to install the bleachers, but the rink itself will be ready for play. I assure you the rink renos are worth the wait! . ## <u>Picapix Puzzle</u>

A picture will evolve as you complete the puzzle. Start with the largest numbers or combination of, colour in squares and proceed to work back and forth between columns and rows.

The three basic rules are:


- Numbers represent how many squares you colour in to form a group or block.
- Leave at least one square between these blocks.
- The sequential order of the numbers is the order of the blocks, i.e., top number for a column is the top block, and left-most number for a row is the left-most block.

The "logic count method" shown below is very useful:


The clue at the left of the row is 6, so count 6 squares

from the left to right and then count 6 squares from right to left. Confidently shade in the overlapping squares. This same method can be applied even when there is more than one number, remembering to allow one empty square between groups or blocks. Use a second colour for elimination of background squares.

## **Redwood Meadows Emergency Services**

t's the most wonderful time of the year! Here's some holiday safety tips to keep you safe as you enjoy the holidays:

- 1. Merry and Bright: Carefully inspect holiday light strings each year and discard any with frayed cords, cracked lamp holders, or loose connections. When replacing bulbs, unplug the light string and be sure to match voltage and wattage to the original bulb.
- **2. Lights Out:** Always turn off holiday lights when you leave the house unattended or when going to bed.
- **3. Fresh Is Best:** Try to purchase a freshly cut tree, as they're more resistant to ignition. Keep your Christmas tree watered and away from open candles.

#### 4. Fake it!

If you buy an artificial tree, make sure it's labeled "fire resistant." Fire-resistant trees are less susceptible to catching fire.

- **5. Work as a team:** When stringing lights and decorations above your normal reach, be sure to use a proper ladder with someone supporting the base.
- 6. The Great Outdoors: When hanging outdoor lights, keep electrical connectors off the ground and away from metal rain gutters. Use insulated tape or plastic clips instead of metal nails or tacks to hold them in place.

#### 7. Don't burn wrapping paper in the fireplace.


Paper burns very hot, which can ignite a fire in any residue is ample room for us to move in/out of your front in your chimney or the chase. ## 8. Prevent electrical cord damage.

Don't mount lights in a way that might damage the cords, and avoid using nails or tacks. Use hooks or insulated staples instead.

#### 9. Secure candles.

Keep candles on a sturdy base to prevent tipping. Never leave a lit candle unattended.



#### 11. Use unbreakable ornaments.

If you have fragile ornament, place them out of reach from pets and kids.

- **12. Sound the Alarm:** Test your smoke alarms monthly to make sure they work, and be sure to install smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms on every level of your home -- especially near sleeping areas.
- **13. Skip the fake food:** Avoid decorations that look like candy or food if you have young children or pets in the house.
- **14. Beware of poisonous plants:** While festive, poinsettias are poisonous when eaten, so keep them out of reach of kids and pets.
- **15. Friendly Furnace:** To help prevent carbon monoxide hazards in your home, have a qualified professional perform a yearly maintenance check of your furnace and venting system. Clean or replace your furnace filter frequently during the heating seasons.
- 16. Clean the Clutter: Don't store combustible materials near your tree, furnace or block furnace vents. Think of your friendly local firefighters when you're decorating near front doors and ensure there is ample room for us to move in/out of your front entrance, without bumping into Frosty the Snowman! And...if you see our big red trucks coming down the highway with lights flashing; pull over, STOP, and let us get quickly and safely to a neighbor in need!



## Mortgage Matters - What's Forecasted for 2020-2021 Mortgages?

here are we today?

• Bank of Canada (BoC) rate, that we often refer to as the "prime rate", hikes have been

paused since October 2018.

- The BoC has left the prime rate unchanged even though the USA and Europe have cut rates to respond to weaker economic activity.
- Most economists forecasted that the BoC would remain unchanged until after the federal election in Canada.
- The prime rate set by the BoC increases when the
  economy is doing well; but if there is a recession, then
  lower rates are used to stimulate the economy. Since
  forecasters are expecting rates to begin dropping it
  implies they are expecting an economic slowdown or
  recession.
- Canadian fixed mortgage rates did rise in October due to investors selling off assets, Government of Canada (GoC) bonds, for example. The selling of these bonds causes their prices to fall and their yields, which our fixed mortgage rates are based on, to rise.

Predictions are that fixed rates will probably be lower or similar to today. Any potential increases should be modest at 10-25 bps.

You can lock in a rate up to 120 days before closing on a home sale or the renewal of your mortgage. This is insurance in case rates increase.

Variable rates may be a better bet (if you have the risk tolerance for fluctuations!). Based on the latest forecasts, variable rates are more likely to fall than rise in the next two years.

The scary part of this forecast is that dropping rates would be an appropriate bond-market response to an upcoming recession.

#### What's forecasted ahead?

- The consensus is that now that the federal election is over rates will begin to drop in the short-term.
- Rate decreases will also be in response to an economic slowdown.
- Several key indicators point to a 2020 USA recession which would inevitably impact Canada.
- Canada has had an inverted yield curve (when 1-year bonds yield higher interest rates than
- 10-year bonds) for several months now. All past recessions have been preceded by an
- inverted yield curve.
- No matter how well-researched the economist's prediction are, mortgage rate forecasting is
- only an educated guess.

## I have a mortgage renewal coming up, should I be worried?

Borrowers generally do not have to undergo the "stress test or re-qualify" when they renew with their existing lender. This allows the existing lender to offer a much higher rate as they know the borrower may not be in the position to leave. It is so very important to shop around at time of renewal, even if you are unsure if you'd re-qualify.

#### What's a person to do?

Earlier this year, there was a consensus that interest rates would eventually rise but that is likely no longer the case.



long-time staple in the Bragg Creek community for nearly 30 years, the Bavarian Inn is going back to its roots as it starts its latest chapter. Locals Charlie Holschuh and his wife, Pam Shewchuk, who originally opened the restaurant in 1991, have re-launched it again as owners and consulting managers. Joining them are fellow locals—head chef, Samantha Mehler and Nadia Burns as front-of-house manager.

"We are very happy to be back at the Bavarian Inn," says Charlie. "The staff we have right now are the best I have ever had," says Charlie. "They are all local, and very professional and very friendly." The restaurant itself has undergone a bit of a transformation. While it retains a focus on Alpine European cuisine with traditional German-based dishes like goulash and Maultaschen—a veal dumpling with spinach, onion and garlic—the Bavarian Inn also has a feature menu that changes weekly showcasing different seasonal homemade dishes such as pan-seared Icelandic cod with mushroom and squash risotto, and plum and gorgonzola galette. Chef Sammy has brought a decade of experience to the menu, in particular, a keen eye for presentation.

The Bav has also changed up its décor and table settings to encourage patrons, and locals especially, to "pop in for an appy and a glass of wine," says Charlie. "We've made it more casual friendly so that people feel like they can just come in anytime. We're not just your 'special occasion' restaurant." What remains the same is the Bavarian Inn's commitment to service and quality. It continues to deliver a delicious brunch every Saturday and Sunday, and will also continue its participation in community events like Taste of Bragg Creek, which was started by Charlie, as well as host its own events like Oktoberfest. 

Alberta needs a fair deal from our federation, and it is my honour to be granted the opportunity to fight for it.




