# **Train to be a Flood Mitigation Volunteer**

Redwood Town Council met on April 3 and April 17. The fiscal year's operations and financial budget were finalized. The AXIA initiative and the repercussions from the vote were also debated. Council members are looking forward to the annual general meeting on Tuesday, May 15 at 7 pm at Redwood House



to have preparedness at an active level, the Townsite is partnering with Redwood Meadows Emergency Services (RMES) to have a volunteer base of residents trained, organized and familiar with local flood mitigation protocols and apparatus. Volunteers are asked to meet at Redwood House on Saturday, May 26 at 1 pm for training.

#### **INFRASTRUCTURE**

Town Council is greatly appreciative of the amount of passion residents showed on the AXIA initiative. As relayed to the Townsite, Council is in support of the special resolution vote results from April 12. The deal as proposed was defeated, and our infrastructure lead, Councillor Allen, will continue to work on the possibility of other options to provide the Townsite with high-speed internet.

The number of residents who came out, were involved, or provided constructive feedback in favour of or in opposition to the proposal shows promise in relation to the ongoing engagement needed about the lease negotiations and other pertinent issues facing the Townsite.

The Townsite has applied to the federal government for Canada's Summer Student Program (CSSP). Redwood plans to hire several students to work with our operations department for the summer season. The 16-week program is open to qualified applicants; please contact the town office at 403-949-3563 for details.

With the excess amount of snowfall, the expected rise in temperatures and the oncoming spring melt, Townsite reminds residents to ensure that they place their eavestrough downspouts down and away from their foundations. In addition, residents are asked, if applicable, to ensure that sump pumps are plugged in and operational. Please do not direct the flow of water from your sump pump into the floor drain as this may overload our wastewater system. If you need advice or feedback on your sump pump drainage, please contact the townsite at 403-949-3563. If you experience water in your basement, or notice areas around roads or ditches not draining, please also contact the townsite.

#### **EMERGENCY SERVICES**

Our operations department is actively preparing for the oncoming spring melt. In the event of an emergency, and

If you are interested, visit <u>redwoodmeadows.ab.ca</u>, look under *Community* then *Volunteers* and place "flood mitigation" in the description to sign up.

The Townsite conducted a test of our emergency call-out system on April 18. The system is designed to inform residents of an emergency situation. If you were NOT notified by BOTH email and by telephone, please let the townsite office know. PLEASE only contact the office if you DID NOT receive a call and email.

In the event of an emergency, the Townsite will be utilizing this system along with our own social media platforms including our website, Twitter, and Facebook to relay pertinent information. In addition, there are several other apps for your personal devices that can alert you to provincial alerts that may affect us. Check <a href="https://www.alertready.ca">www.alertready.ca</a> or <a href="https://www.alertra.ca">www.emergencyalert.alberta.ca</a>.

Our Townsite operations manager is keeping a close watch on our community's preparedness for our spring melt. Daily or weekly updates are given to our townsite manager and to town council as needed. The lift station at the north end of the community is designed to relieve the surface drainage issues; dealing with groundwater is a major step in reducing the concerns of water permeation.

#### **FINANCIAL**

MNP, an independent financial auditor, has finished its audit of council's finance department and presented its findings to council members at the April 17 meeting. Budgetary constraints and proper fiscal management are always at the forefront of these discussions.

#### **BYLAWS**

Did you know, that your garbage service works under several different sets of rules? The garbage truck driver, working by himself, can choose to ignore any of the following rules (but at his own risk and hazard). His employer and the Townsite have a contract which

qualifies much of what he does but agrees with or exceeds the Redwood Meadows Waste Management Bylaw 2010-02. The driver must also follow the Waste Control Regulation of Alberta 192/1996 and the Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act, Revised Statutes of Alberta 2000, Chapter E-12.

In summary, our Townsite bylaw states the following:

- 1. Domestic waste is defined to exclude construction, renovation, demolition, hazardous and biomedical waste amongst others (10.1).
- 2. Domestic waste shall NOT be placed "curbside" before 7:00 am on the day of collection (6.1e i). Our current contract is set at 7:30 am for pick up.
- 3. A maximum of three containers of waste NOT greater than 80 Liters (17.6 Imp. Gal.) in volume and NOT greater than 15 Kilograms (33.0 Lbs.) in mass. (5.1 a, 6.1d v & 6.1d vi)
- 4. Containers should be designed to, and maintained to, be impervious to Animals, Birds and Weather and do NOT have lids attached to them. (6.1d ii, 6.1d vii) (Secured by straps are fine, not hinged)

5. Loose waste is not permitted (9.4 ii)

So, treat the driver kindly, stay within the rules, and may your garbage days be bright, shiny, and empty of trash.

#### **COMMUNICATIONS**

The Emergency Services Department Open House takes place Sat., May 12 from 1-3pm. Come meet with representation from the many different service departments that serve our community: RCMP, RMES, Tsuut'ina Police and Alberta Fish and Wildlife.

Many of our residents have noticed changes in the town's social media presence. We have increased our weekly communication through the emailed *Updater*. We have longer, more detailed submissions to the monthly community newsletter from our town council. We have included in the Chatter updates from our emergency services department and the RCMP. We are working on updating our emergency call-out list to ensure all residents are notified of an emergency. We have re-introduced Redwood's Twitter feed, with frequent updates of infor-



mation. We have rebuilt the town's web page to be more user-friendly and contain more pertinent information.

The next step in the process is our Facebook page, which needs some improvement. We wish to use the page as an information page for residents and the public. In an online media world, many people, including residents, visitors, and prospective home buyers, use Facebook to find out more about a community. In researching comparable sites, most local communities use this approach.

Townsite staff and council recognize that feedback from residents is an essential and integral part of keeping our community involved. We often encourage residents to email the townsite office or our council. To ensure an avenue exists for respectful and constructive dialogue, the Townsite has constructed a Facebook community discussion page, similar to others in the area. This will be a closed group, open only to residents of Redwood Meadows. Redwood Meadows Forum is now operational, and we encourage residents to enjoy it through a respectful and lively debate. As with any closed group, all commenters will need to be approved by the group administrator, and the discussions will be monitored to ensure respect, civility, and overall appropriateness of submissions for discussions.

#### **LEASE UPDATES**

There is constant work happening regarding the lease negotiations. Our townsite manager meets with representatives from Tsuu'tina Nation on a weekly basis regarding operational, legal and administrative dialogue pertaining to lease negotiations.

There is a community working group (LAWG) consisting of three councillors and community members who meet

on a biweekly basis, to discuss our community's interests and brainstorm ideas. The townsite manager and the councillors from the working group report back to council at our regularly scheduled meetings to discuss their progress and get direction for the next meeting.

Our townsite manager, mayor and deputy mayor meet with Tsuu'tina representatives on the alternate weeks from the LAWG meetings. On a weekly basis, more than 40 hours are devoted to lease discussions and moving the process forward. There is a Gantt chart (a working schedule of projects and timelines) that is in place and is used as a point of reference for our discussions. With the Framework Discussion Document signed by both our community and Tsuu'tina Nation to work on the lease and related issues, it is important that we are meeting our own deadlines, and we are pleased with the progress to date.

If you would like further updates, please come out to the lease information nights. This is a chance for our LAWG group and Town Council to inform residents in person, and to answer any questions. The next lease information night will be held May 2 at 7 pm at Redwood House.

#### **COUNCIL MEETINGS**

Council meetings are held on the first and third Tuesday of every month at 7 pm at Redwood House. Meeting agendas are made available to the community on the town's website prior to the meeting.



drop off donations in coming weeks, this number will likely continue to rise.


Thank you to all of the 600+ outstanding volunteers from Cochrane and area without whom none of this would have

# Is Your Sump Pump Springtime Ready?

Every year, millions of litres of water flow into the municipal drainage system from residential rooftops and indoor plumbing. Most people don't think about how the water is collected or where it goes. It's a different matter, though, when a spring melt comes, the drainage system falters or there is water in the basement.

Water damage from flooding costs time, money and inconvenience. Fortunately, there are many things you can do to reduce your risk. Prevention and maintenance are the keys. Looking at your home now and fixing any problem areas before the next major water event can save you a lot of grief.

In any community, private and public drainage systems work together to channel and move sanitary and storm water safely away from homes and neighborhood streets.

The private system is the responsibility of residential and commercial property owners. The public system is owned and operated by the municipality, in this case the Townsite of Redwood Meadows. The sanitary sewer main deals with all water disposed of inside the home. Water from showers, toilets, sinks, dishwashers, clothes washers and floor drains is channelled to a pipe under your basement floor. This pipe is connected to a larger sanitary sewer



pipe located under the street. Sloped lawns and driveways direct water from the roof and the ground to the street or drainage ditches, which in Redwood Meadows is essentially our storm drain system.

This winter our community has had an abundance of snowfall, and now with the spring melt fully underway, it is very important to note that our sanitary system is **NOT** designed to handle the amount of drainage from sump pumps operating in people's homes.

The townsite asks ALL residents at this time NOT to allow their sump pumps to drain into the inside floor drains, outside street drains or the streets as this will lead to possible sewage backup in the home.

All ground water from sump pumps must be drained onto the ground or lawn away from the house on the resident's property. Our operations department will be checking manhole access periodically to ensure compliance.

comaraderie and efficiency of being in the same class.








# **BCCA Welcomes Spring with Another Successful Taste Of Bragg**

# **AB Government Improves West Bragg Creek Trails Protection**

#### AB ENVIRONMENT & PARKS ANNOUNCEMENT

We have something to celebrate as the level of protection for the West Bragg Creek trail network has been improved!

Due to the popularity of the trail network on the public land at Greater West Bragg Creek and Moose Mountain, Alberta Environment and Parks (AEP) has placed a Consultative Notation over this area (CNT 170007). This will ensure the trail network is safeguarded from other proposed land uses. Below is a brief description of the Consultative Notation that AEP, Integrated Resource Management Branch, has recently placed on the West Bragg Creek and Moose Mountain trail networks.

#### What is a CNT?

Notations are instruments used through the Public Lands Act to identify a management intention regarding specific sections of public land by government departments or legal entities. Notations indicate that the holder of the notation wants to be consulted before any commitment or disposition is placed on the land.






# picapix puzzle

The latest Japanese logic puzzle is here! A picture will evolve as you complete the puzzle. Start with the largest numbers or combination of, colour in squares and proceed to work back and forth between columns and rows.

The three basic rules are:

- Numbers represent how many squares you colour in to form a group or block.
- Leave at least one square between these blocks.
- The sequential order of the numbers is the order of the blocks, i.e., top number for a column is the top block, and left-most number for a row is the left-most block.

The "logic count method" shown below is very useful: The clue at the left of the row is 6, so count 6 squares from the left to right and then count 6 squares from right to left.




Confidently shade in the overlapping squares. This is spatial reasoning. Even one shaded square can lead to others.

This same method can be applied even when there is more than one number, remembering to allow one empty square between groups or blocks. Use a second colour for elimination of background squares. 

# Compare 'Good' and 'Bad' Debt in Times of Increasing Interest Rates

Many Canadian's have found their debt loads heavier now that the Bank of Canada and the country's lenders have raised their benchmark rates and prime rate. On the other hand, increased lending rates are good news for account holders as the prime rate also affects interest rates for savings and investment accounts.

How can you avoid falling further into debt or take advantage of higher rates of return? Here are some considerations:

- In a perfect world, we'd all like to live totally debtfree but that simply is not reality for many of us. Trying to pay off all debt should be the goal, but if the reality is that some debt has to stay, then before considering any further actions, understand exactly what kind of debts you have.
- There is good debt and there is bad debt. Good debt may include a cost that is incurred to invest in your future. A student loan is a good debt because you are investing in your ability to make more money. Debt you have on real estate or your primary residence is a

good debt because this is an asset and you're accumulating equity. Debt you incur to buy an investment, assuming the income from the investment far exceeds the cost of the debt, may be a good debt as well.

- If you have tax deductibility because of a debt, this is a good debt.
- Bad debt is your credit cards, department store cards, lines of credit and/or any debt with higher interest rates, no asset generated, and/or no investment opportunity. Pay off the debt with the higher interest rate first
- A potential concern for anyone with a variable rate mortgage during times of prime rate increases is the increasing cost. Consider locking into a fixed mortgage rate. If you are worried about the exposure to higher mortgage costs, this may be an option to rein in the risk
- Consider what kind of debt you are taking on; but more importantly, how, when and what your plan for repaying it is.

What if you need to apply for more debt?

Care about your credit score and check it often. If you are applying for a new debt (especially a mortgage), consider your credit limit and never use more than 70 percent of limit on one single account; or more than 35 percent of all your overall credit capacity. As much as you can, pay down existing debts (especially lines of credit or anything "revolving") to open up your capacity.

What if you have no debt to pay off, but want to take advantage of the increased rates? You should always speak to an investment professional about your personal situation, but some options may be a regular ol' savings account; maximum contributions to an RESP; and, once your RESP is max'ed, an RRSP or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

There are many, many options for additional investments. Consult with your financial planner. It's impossible to predict what is going to happen in the coming months or years, but we do know the time of low interest rates, easy credit, and freewheeling lending policies are over.
