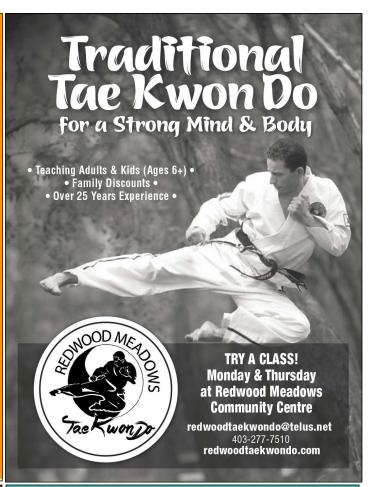

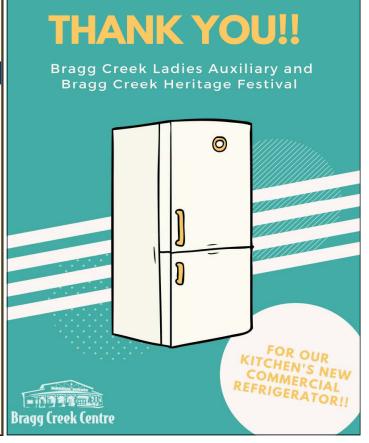

## Barrier Frustration Can Lead to Behavioural Issues

Barrier frustration is something that happens when we are prevented from getting to where we want to go or

doing what we want to do—the way we want to do it.

Traffic is an excellent example of something that creates barrier frustration. I swear that when I'm running late I manage to hit every red light in existence, and every person who does not understand what a gas pedal is for is driving in front of me.

It starts slowly, but by the time I've hit the tenth red light I'm ready to start screaming at the idiots who design our roadways, and for people who don't seem to understand that speed limits are, in fact, how fast you should be driving – I'm ready to tear them apart limb from limb!

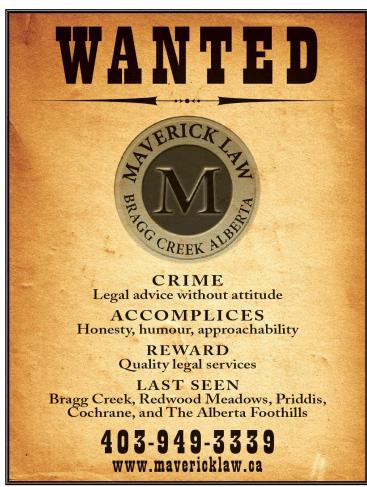
Barrier frustration happens with dogs too. A dog's natural inclination is to check things out and meet and greet stuff in their environment.

In the "old days," dogs were let out of the house and they went their merry way doing a walkabout throughout the community. They were free to explore on their own terms, meeting and greeting who and what they felt comfortable with and avoiding things when they didn't feel confident. That is how to build a well-socialized dog.

Nowadays, society's rules have changed all that for our dogs. People are forced to use all manner of things to prevent our dogs from roaming: chain link kennels, fencing, ropes to tie them up in the yard, shock collars, invisible fences.

The problem with all of these things is that they can create barrier frustration. Even just taking our dogs on a leashed walk can cause barrier frustration. These "tools" prevent dogs from doing what they want to do or going where they want to go—the way the inner dog wants to.

## dog behaviour

Emotions kick in, and emotions, along with all the brain and nervous system activity, are not under conscious control.

Actors, for example, can teach themselves to cry or show anger on cue, and we can learn to control our emotions, but pure emotions are not controllable. Just ask anyone who's experienced a panic attack. Unlike us, our dogs can't lie around all afternoon watching Dr. Phil to help them understand their frustrations.

According to the book, *Discovering Psychology*: "An emotion is a complex psychological state that involves three distinct components: a subjective experience, a physiological response, and a behavioral or expressive response.""

Many people believe that they can stick a dog out in a fenced yard and that's all they need to do. The dog should be happy that it has a yard to play in, and that's that. But when the barking and carrying on starts, they get angry at the dog while it's out. People also believe that taking a dog for a walk on a leash, and giving them a sharp jerk when the dog tries to approach and greet another dog or person is how to "train" a dog to behave the way we want them to at the end of a leash.

Emotional wants and desires are why the behaviour starts to take a nose dive, and barrier frustration is why it can escalate.

Just like me when I'm trying to get where I want to go in traffic that is riddled with red lights, and what I believe are "uncooperative people," a dog's emotions escalate every time they are prevented from doing what they want to do when they want to do it—especially if a punishment or

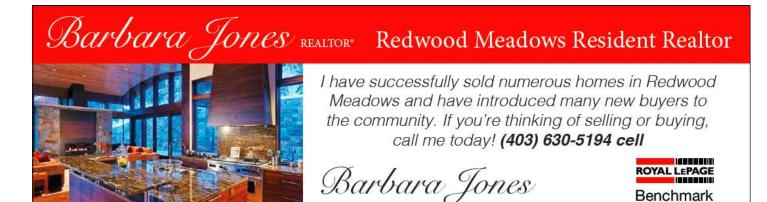
scary thing is added to the event. Unless we teach our dogs that behaving the way we want them to is a "good thing," the frustration can reach epic proportions.

I was once walking on a path in a park behind a line of houses with chain link fences separating the yards from the park. I came across two dogs in a yard who were barking, charging the fence and snarling at me. Can you imagine the frustration that can build when a dog is trapped in a yard with people and other dogs walking by, clearly visible through the chain link, but NEVER being able to meet and greet all these people or other dogs? I honestly feared that if they were to break that barrier, well, it wouldn't be pretty! The sad part is that the dogs are blamed for their misbehaviour, and if they did hurt someone or another dog, they would likely be put down.

The REALITY is that the people are to blame. They force their dogs to stay in a confined area for long periods of time, with action, clearly visible, on the other side of the barrier, and that includes ropes and invisible fences. Over days, weeks, months, even years, the dog's frustration grows until it reaches anger or even rage. Then the dog is blamed for not doing what we want it to do.

When we're trying to change a behaviour like barking and carrying on behind a fence, at the end of a rope or leash, or in a kennel, we start by changing the emotional response to what's happening in the environment. And, again - we target the *reward system* to achieve that.

## Care in the Creek: Continuing to Put 'Family' in Family Practice

Change is underway at the Care in the Creek Medical Centre, but what hasn't changed is its dedication to great care and its friendly, welcoming atmosphere. Dr. Cunning and Dr. Noordman are looking for a third doctor to join the team as Dr. Wiesenberg has moved to another clinic.



Not to worry, though, the clinic has expanded its hours to 8pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays so you can still expect the same level of care while the search for a new doc is on. The clinic is also open the second Saturday of every month. There's often room for same-day appointments so don't hesitate to call if medical concerns arise.

Dr. Wiesenberg's patients are welcome to remain at the clinic, but "it's important that people know that the custodian of their medical file is their family doctor," says Dr. Noordman. "So, a copy of the file will stay at Care in the Creek, but if they wish to change clinics, their doctor must make the request for the file."

If you decide to stay, just give the clinic a call, especially if you have test results pending during this transition period. "Normally, no news is good news, but just call us to double check," Noordman advises. "Within a few weeks, we should have all results. If we don't have them, we can send a request to the doctor or check the provincial system. But we have to be alerted to look or send those requests."

This fall, local pharmacist Shaylene Coates will join the clinic to assist with chronic disease management as a diabetes educator. The clinic has also started offering speech therapy through a local therapist.

And did you know that Care in the Creek services include:

- Mental health support
- Stitches for lacerations/wounds
- Wart and skin tag removal
- IUDs
- Immunizations (tetanus, flu etc.)
- Ingrown toenails
- Travel advice

Ultimately, the clinic remains a family and community care clinic, focussed on serving residents of Bragg Creek/Redwood Meadows and area. "Our main focus is on local residents, but we will accept any patient wishing to come to our clinic. We'll continue with all the things we've been

doing—community events, working with the schools, little library and more. We are a community clinic," affirms Noordman.

If you're unsure whether you're registered at Care in the Creek, call the clinic at (403) 949-2457. The staff are happy to assist you with any questions or concerns. You can

also find them online at <u>careinthecreek.com</u> and on Facebook. Additionally, if you know of a doctor who could help out at the clinic in the interim or who may be interested in a long-term position, please let Dr. Noordman know.

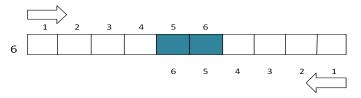
## picapix puzzle

The latest Japanese logic puzzle is here! A picture will evolve as you complete the puzzle. Start with the largest numbers or combination of, colour in squares and proceed to work back and forth between columns and rows.

The three basic rules are:

- Numbers represent how many squares you colour in to form a group or block.
- Leave at least one square between these blocks.
- The sequential order of the numbers is the order of the blocks, i.e., top number for a column is the top block, and left-most number for a row is the leftmost block.

The "logic count method" shown below is very useful: The clue at the left of the row is 6, so count 6 squares from the left to right and then count 6 squares from right to left.



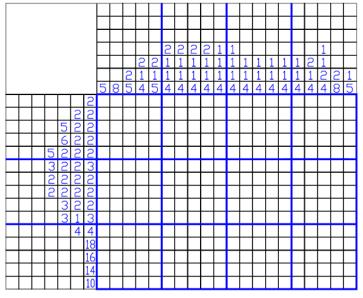
Confidently shade in the overlapping squares. This is spatial reasoning. Even one shaded square can lead to others.

This same method can be applied even when there is more than one number, remembering to allow one empty square between groups or blocks. Use a second colour for elimination of background squares. This is critical for solving.

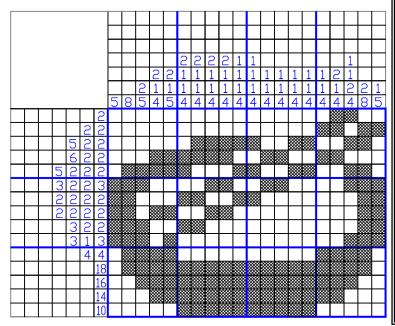

## Do You Qualify for the Mortgage You Can Afford?

There are a lot of factors that a lender considers when deciding to give you a mortgage. There's a difference between knowing you can afford a mortgage and actually qualifying for one.

### **CAPACITY**

Lenders also don't like to see too much debt and/or maxed out credit cards.

### **CAPITAL**

This is the amount of money you must invest in the

property yourself. Lenders don't like to take all the risk. Make sure you have at least the minimum down payment. That down payment should come from your own sources; it may be cash, RRSP savings, or a gift from a family member. In certain certain situations it may be borrowed as long as you can manage that extra debt.

### **CHARACTER**

This is an overall impression of your trustworthiness. It's a look at the big picture. Lenders look at how long you've been employed and how secure you are. They will also look at your ability to save and manage your credit.

### **COLLATERAL**

You are important as an applicant, but equally important is the property you're buying. The house is pledged as security for the loan.

FYI - for Redwood Meadows properties. The property head lease is reviewed to ensure that a minimum of five years extends beyond the mortgage amortization to the lease expiry date. With an expiry of 5 Sept 2049, this caps an amortization at 26 years (2049 – 2018 = 31 years remaining; less 5-year gap = 26). Note that 25 years is the maximum for CMHC-insured business anyway, but 30 years would be an option for refinances if the lease expiry didn't cap it. It's important to note that each year that, with 2049 as the lease expiry date, each passing year reduces the available amortization for borrowers.

### **CREDIT**

This is your credit history—how long you've been using credit. The more years you've been an active credit user, the better.

The good news is the housing market is active; people are still buying and selling. If you're in the market, put a plan together to help you get into your new home.
