## **REOPENING OF TVET SECTOR**

The announcement by the Minister on 30 April 2020 regarding the return to work and colleges by staff and students is based on a risk adjusted strategy for the entire PSET sector.

- That the first cohort of students can only return under stage 3 of the COVID-19 pandemic and 1 June 2020 is the tentative date.
- Return of students in the CET colleges will be largely aligned to the DBE plans because they follow almost similar programmes and use schools' facilities.
- Return to work should be guided by:
  - DPSA Circular No 07 of 2020: Guidelines for the Containment/Management of the Corona Virus (COVID
     19) in the Public Service.
  - DPSA Circular 18 of 2020: Public Service Return to Work Guideline after Easing of the National Lockdown.
  - Final OHS COVID 19 Directive.
  - The Department of Employment and Labour's Return to Work Regulations.
- In some instances, the 'return to work' may include remote modalities of such work, as determined by line managers/supervisors.
- 33% of Regional Offices staff will return on 1 June 2020 depending on compliance with relevant regulations.
- The Minister's commitment that the return to work will take into cognisance:
  - Firstly, whatever we do in the PSET sector, our responsibility is to lower the infection curve.
  - Secondly, we must save the 2020 academic year, but not at the expense of lives.
- Thirdly, our efforts to save the academic year must avoid worsening the infection curve.
